The LNHS Library

The LNHS library is a rich resource for naturalists with an extensive collection of books, journals, and other publications on British natural history. It is housed in the Angela Marmont Centre for UK Biodiversity at the Natural History Museum, Cromwell Road and there is a Society Librarian. The catalogue is available on the Society's website. The library is accessible anytime the Angela Marmont Centre is open and the LNHS Librarian Team are onsite every Wednesday from 10:00 to 15:00 and every third Saturday of the month 13:00-15:00. You can get a librarian to help at other times by arrangement, email library@lnhs.org.uk.

Bookham Commons Survey

We'd love to see more visits and recording taking place in 2026 to develop this long-running survey. The group meets at Bookham train station at 10.45 am on the second Saturday of every month. The 9.53 am from London Waterloo via Clapham Junction arrives just before this. (Bookham is a little way outside Zone 6 so you will need an extension ticket.) Car parking is also available nearby. From the station platform, the group can walk straight onto the site, which includes oak woodland, scrub grassland, a stream and nine ponds and has lots to interest naturalists.

You can explore the site on a walk with the group, and the focus can vary depending on the interests of members. Everyone is welcome. We suggest you bring binoculars and ID guides, etc and encourage you to record your finds. Of course, you are also welcome to explore independently if you prefer. Later in the year, we may be able to organise some field study days led by an expert in a particular group. We'll add details to the website calendar. Do get in touch via the Secretary or the President if you'd like to volunteer as a leader.

We can use the LNHS hut at lunchtime. There are facilities here for making tea and coffee as well as a toilet. (At present there is also a café at the station serving drinks and pastries. There are no other shops though.) 


