# London Birding Monthly Highlights: Rotherhithe, Southwark Compiled by John Cadera

The LNHS recording area occupies a 20-mile radius surrounding St Paul's Cathedral. This area encompasses a wide range of wildlife habitats and some outstanding nature reserves, which are inhabited by a surprisingly high number of bird species that are recorded each year. Around 350 species of birds have been recorded since 1900. In a typical year, over 200 species are recorded. Given below are a series of monthly highlights from January 2022 from the London Borough of Southwark. The borough is densely populated and has the River Thames on its northern border. The only significant patch of wild area is the Russia Dock Woodland in east London, situated on the south bank of the River Thames, which is within view of the city buildings of Canary Wharf on the north bank. Within a couple of kilometres of Russia Dock is Southwark Park, a largely formal park with a pond that attracts wintering **Shoveler**. In the south of Southwark Borough is Burgess Park, a large park that is predominantly formal with a wild border, which is important for passerines, on one side. The Lake attracts **Shoveler** and the occasional **Goldeneye**. Although Southwark is relatively poor for birds when compared to many other London boroughs, these monthly reports demonstrate that a decent mix of birds can be found in densely built urban centres where small areas have been set aside for nature.

# 2025

# June 2025

Southwark Park: Three pairs of Canada Goose had a total of 12 young between them on 12th. The Greylag have not been as successful, after promising start with 5 young, there was only one left by the end of the month. The Egyptian Goose pair have raised 8 young to a decent size. We also found at least 7 young Mallard between several females. A pair of Tufted Duck remained throughout most of the month. There was also a brief visit by a pair of **Pochard** on 13<sup>th</sup>. We had **Swift** twice over the park during the month; two on 14<sup>th</sup> and one on 21<sup>st</sup>. **Stock Dove** was heard on a couple of visits and on 27<sup>th</sup> we found a group of 13 **Woodpigeon** at the north side. We found only one Little Grebe during the month and it appears that breeding has failed. The regular pair of Lesser Black-backed Gull were seen throughout. Two **Cormorant** went over on 2<sup>nd</sup> and **Grey Heron** was seen on several occasions. **Great Spotted** Woodpecker was seen and heard several times and we also found 6 Ringed-neck Parakeet. A Jay was at The Bowling Green on 7<sup>th</sup>, this, as it turned out was the only report from the area this month. A **Coal Tit** was heard on 21<sup>st</sup>. Small numbers of **House Martin** were seen; 5 on 14<sup>th</sup> and 4 on 27th. Three Blackcap were singing at the start of the month but these became irregular by the end. Two Goldcrest were also heard, one of them in the conifers outside the running track. 25+ Starling were also found near the running track on 12th, we could hear several juveniles with them. Few sightings of **Mistle Thrush**, but on 27<sup>th</sup> we found three; two at the north side and a single near Lower Road.

**<u>King's Stairs Garden:</u>** No notable sightings from this area.

Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond: Pair of Canada Goose continue with three young, on 4<sup>th</sup> we found 7 Tufted Duck with one chick, by 17<sup>th</sup> only a pair of adults remained and the chick had been taken. Swift records continue to be scant with one seen on 4<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>. A Collared Dove was calling most of the month near Globe Pond. One Herring Gull and one Lesser Black-backed Gull were the only gulls this month. A Grey Heron was seen most of the month and on 25<sup>th</sup> a female Sparrowhawk was in Russia Dock Woodland. Parties of Great, Blue and Long-tailed Tit were seen wandering around with fledglings. House Martin numbers have been low over the area; 4 on 4<sup>th</sup>, 2 on 17<sup>th</sup> and 5 on 25<sup>th</sup>. Two Chiffchaff were singing at the start of the month, also at least one Blackcap still singing and we found two fledged at the Turbine. Two Goldcrest were in Russia Dock Woodland on 4<sup>th</sup>. The Song Thrush continued to sing and on 4<sup>th</sup> we found 5 male Blackbird together in Russia Dock Woodland. c5 Goldfinch were in Long Meadow on 23<sup>rd</sup>. Along nearby Albion Channel the Reed Warber pair have been actively feeding young utilising a fox scat as a buffet, picking off flies for their brood.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> 9 Mute Swan (pair with 7 young) doing well, we only found one **Egyptian** Goose and no sign of young. 14 Tufted Duck were present most of the month. On 25<sup>th</sup> we found 4 House Martin and one Sand Martin over.

<u>Canada Water:</u> Nothing notable, however it is good to see that the grass and reed areas are doing well.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> Pair of **Great Crested Grebe** reported throughout.

<u>Thames at Rotherhithe:</u> Two pair of **Sand Martin** have returned with one pair seen carrying food.

**Bermondsey:** On 7<sup>th</sup> a male **Kestrel** was hovering over Rouel Road Estate was mobbed by crows. This is an excellent record, I have not seen a kestrel over that area for over 6 years. Another highlight was a party of 6 **Swift** over briefly heading for the Old Kent Road.

# May 2025

<u>Southwark Park:</u> Three pairs of **Canada Goose** have 11 young between them. A pair of **Greylag** had 5 young on 19<sup>th</sup>, this is the first breeding the park of this species for several years. The **Egyptian Goose** pair bred again and had 9 young on 26<sup>th</sup> but there was no sign of adults or young at the end of the month. A pair of **Tufted Duck** remained most of the month but no signs of breeding so far. We are not sure what is going on with duck breeding this year, perhaps several early broods were taken by **Lesser Black-backed Gull**, of which, a pair is usually lurking, or **Grey Heron** which was also seen on and off during the month. At the end of the month we found one new brood of **Mallard**. In contrast **Moorhen** and **Coot** do not seem to have the same high mortality. **Stock Dove** has been scarce with only one sighting on 26<sup>th</sup>. **Little Grebe** were equally elusive, we only saw one adult and so far no sign of successful breeding despite activity around the nest site several weeks ago. **Coal Tit** was heard by the Athletics centre, two **Chiffchaff** and two **Blackcap** were singing at the start of the month. Two **Goldcrest** on 11<sup>th</sup> and on 19<sup>th</sup> we counted 16 **Starling**, we could hear at least two juveniles in the group indicating successful breeding somewhere in Rotherhithe. A pair of **Mistle Thrush** 

still present around the running track and two **Goldfinch** over on 5<sup>th</sup>. On 29<sup>th</sup> three **Greenfinch** visited a feeder near the park, a male and two female/immatures.

**<u>King's Stairs Garden:</u>** No notable sightings from this area.

Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond: The Canada Goose pair had three remaining young by the end of the month. On 4<sup>th</sup> a party of 7 Mute Swan flew over. At least 7 Tufted Duck remained on Globe Pond throughout. On 3<sup>rd</sup> one Swift was over Stave Hill Ecology Park. Stock Dove was seen on all visits with three recorded on 4<sup>th</sup>. On 31<sup>st</sup> A Collared Dove was calling near Globe Pond. A Grey Heron was in the area most days, two were at Globe Pond on 29<sup>th</sup>. Great Spotted Woodpecker was seen and heard most days. On 20<sup>th</sup> a Kestrel went over Stave Hill Ecology Park, a great find of this now scarce species. A pair of Jay were seen on 13<sup>th</sup>. Two House Martin were feeding over Stave Hill on 31<sup>st</sup>. 5 Chiffchaff and 5 Blackcap were singing early in the month and on 31<sup>st</sup> a Reed Warbler was singing in the bushes near Alfred Salter School. The territory on nearby Albion Channel is still occupied. With a report of two from Canada Water, this is the highest count of Reed Warbler from the area for some years. The Song Thrush continues to sing around Russia Dock Woodland. On 31<sup>st</sup> we found a male Grey Wagtail at the small pond behind Globe Pond.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> The **Mute Swan** pair still have 7 young, surprisingly the **Egyptian Goose** pair have managed to get 5 young to a good, survivable age. 10 **Tufted Duck** were seen on 28<sup>th</sup>, also one **Swift**; this is a poor showing and generally there seem to be fewer in South London this year. A family party of **Long-tailed Tit** was seen near Deal Porters on 28<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Canada Water:</u> The **Mute Swan** pair seem to have abandoned, a nest with eggs was seen by others but by the end of the month we found no sign. 4 **Tufted Duck**, 2 **Cormorant** and a **Grey Heron** were amongst the usual suspects. Two **Reed Warbler** were reported during the month however since the reeds are still growing they were likely drop ins as we did not find any on our visits. **Grey Wagtail** has also been regularly seen.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> One **Great Crested Grebe** was present throughout the month.

<u>Thames at Rotherhithe:</u> 13 Mute Swan were on the river on 14<sup>th</sup>, two Swift were also seen. A Common Sandpiper at Rotherhithe Jetty was a good record. On 26<sup>th</sup> a pair of Sand Martin returned, this is promising as there was no sign of them last year. 14 House Martin were counted at the usual site on 14<sup>th</sup>.

**Bermondsey:** The only notable sighting was of two **Swift** on 8<sup>th</sup>.

# **April 2025**

<u>Southwark Park:</u> A **Greylag** joined the 4 to 6 Canada Goose that are currently resident. On 7<sup>th</sup> four **Tufted Duck** dropped in but for most of the month only one pair remained. We found singles of **Stock Dove** at the north side and near the playing fields. The **Little Grebe** pair have nested, a waterlogged pile of dead leaves and compost, is well hidden under overhanging bramble. **Great Spotted Woodpecker** was only seen once, on 3<sup>rd</sup>. A **Red Kite** was seen over the park on 22<sup>nd</sup>. A pair of **Jay** were in their usual area along the Carriageway, on 19<sup>th</sup> we saw one making a very odd call that sounded something like a Common Buzzard. **Coal Tit** sang regularly from various locations. On 7<sup>th</sup> we found a **Willow Warbler** by The Lake, we watched it for several minutes but like all our Willow Warblers this year only sang for a few seconds. Three **Blackcap** and two **Chiffchaff** are singing around the park. 20 **Starling** were seen around the running track; these are now regular here. On 14<sup>th</sup> we also found a **Mistle Thrush** near

the track. On 7<sup>th</sup> we had a passage of **Pied Wagtail** with five feeding at the running track. A **Chaffinch** sang briefly near the playground on 7<sup>th</sup>, we could not locate it and no further singing. **Goldfinch** were also seen in pairs, mostly over, during the month.

<u>King's Stairs Garden:</u> No notable sightings from this area; usual suspects of **Woodpigeon**, **Carrion Crow**, **Magpie**, **Blackbird** and **Robin**.

Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond: The Canada Goose pair had 6 young although at least one likely taken by a **Grey Heron** which was mobbed by the male on 29<sup>th</sup>. Greylag went over on 9<sup>th</sup> (3) and 30<sup>th</sup> (2), 7 Tufted Duck arrived mid-month and remained. One or two **Stock Dove** were heard and seen several times and a **Collared Dove** was seen on 5<sup>th</sup>. A **Sparrowhawk** was over on 2<sup>nd</sup>. **Great Spotted Woodpecker** was seen on several days. On 2<sup>nd</sup> a **Monk Parakeet** went over Stave Hill and dropped into Central Meadow. This is a new record for us, one of few from South London, of this introduced species, also 9 Ringednecked Parakeet went through. Jay and Coal Tit were seen and heard several times during the month. On 6<sup>th</sup> two **House Martin** went over Stave Hill and on 30<sup>th</sup> a **Swallow** went over high. We found three pairs of Long-tailed Tit around the Ecology Park. Willow Warbler was found on 8<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>; singing this year has been just a few short bursts. 4 singing **Chiffchaff** and 6 singing Blackcap are between Onega Gate and Stave Hill. On 8th a Lesser Whitethroat was found in Central Meadow, as so often with this scarce species it did not hang around for long. The Song Thrush continued to sing near The Long Meadow. We found singles of Grey Wagtail and Pied Wagtail, the former dropping in at Globe Pond on 23<sup>rd</sup>. A pair of Chaffinch were found near Mahogany Pond on 30<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> The **Mute Swan** pair had 7 young on 23<sup>rd</sup> while the **Egyptian Goose** pair had 5 young on 23<sup>rd</sup> and had lost one by 30<sup>th</sup>. On 17<sup>th</sup> 5 **Shelduck** flew downriver past Salt Quay, this is our highest count through Rotherhithe. **Tufted Duck** numbers were 36 on 2<sup>nd</sup> and down to 16 for most of the month. Other notables were two **Chiffchaff** and a **Blackcap** singing along Deal Porters Way. On 6<sup>th</sup> 14 **House Martin** and two **Swallow** went through, our first arrivals. **Canada Water:** pair **Mute Swan**, 6 **Tufted Duck**, **Cormorant** and **Black-headed Gull**.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> three <u>Great Crested Grebe</u> were present throughout the month, otherwise there is very little going on since all the gulls left a few weeks ago.

<u>Thames at Rotherhithe:</u> Very little worth reporting along the river, just the usual suspects; 5 Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Herring Gull and Lesser Black-backed Gull on 7<sup>th</sup>.

**<u>Bermondsey:</u>** On morning of 4<sup>th</sup> a **Blackcap** was singing in gardens just off St James' Road, this is the first time that I have heard Blackcap in this area.

# **March 2025**

**Southwark Park:** Canada Goose remained around six for most of the month. The **Egyptian** Goose pair had 13 young on 8<sup>th</sup>, 8 remained by 11<sup>th</sup> and all had been predated by the following week. We counted 10 Mallard on 1<sup>st</sup>. Tufted Duck came and went throughout the month with 8 being highest on 8<sup>th</sup>. On 23<sup>rd</sup> we found four Stock Dove. One Little Grebe was seen most days and two seen on 19<sup>th</sup>. On 23<sup>rd</sup> a Snipe was picked up stunned after it hit a security fence, unfortunately it died soon after. I have only seen two others in the area, both at Russia Dock Woodland. 50+ Black-headed Gull left by the 3<sup>rd</sup> week and only one 1<sup>st</sup> winter plumage bird remained by 31<sup>st</sup>. 8 Herring Gull went over on 19<sup>th</sup>, numbers usually one or two. One Grey Heron seen on 8<sup>th</sup> and Sparrowhawk, a female, was over the park on 31<sup>st</sup>. Great Spotted

**Woodpecker** was seen throughout the month. Five **Jay** passed through on 6<sup>th</sup> and a pair were regularly heard or seen along The Carriage Way. **Coal Tit** was singing near the Gallery on several days, on 31<sup>st</sup> another was singing in the North section near Jamaica Rd. At least two pairs of **Long-tailed Tit** were seen. First **Chiffchaff** singing on 8<sup>th</sup> with two singing by 31<sup>st</sup>. Two **Blackcap** were singing on 31<sup>st</sup> and we also found three singing **Goldcrest**, although we know of at least five territories around the park. 20 **Starling** were around the running track on 11<sup>th</sup> where we also found **Mistle Thrush**, the park is, as far as we can tell, the last breeding site in Rotherhithe. **Goldfinch** have been regularly seen near the Sports ground, also **Pied Wagtail** on 1<sup>st</sup>.

<u>King's Stairs Garden:</u> On 28<sup>th</sup> we found six **Mallard, Mute Swan,** two **Egyptian Goose** and three **Common Gull** on the river. In the gardens a **Blackcap** was signing close to the main road. Also a pair of **Long-tailed Tit**, and two **Blackbird**.

Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond: The Canada Goose pair have settled in and by the end of the month the female was sitting on eggs. A pair of Egyptian Goose were at Globe Pond on 26<sup>th</sup>, we do not get many sightings and pairs rarely stay for more than a day or two. One Mute Swan went over on 29<sup>th</sup>. One Black-headed Gull, one Herring Gull and a pair of Lesser Black-backed Gull were on the only gull records during the month. Four Cormorant over on 12<sup>th</sup> and Grey Heron was on Bea Pond. A male Sparrowhawk was mobbed by a couple of Carrion Crow on 19<sup>th</sup>. Two Great Spotted Woodpecker, four Ringed-necked Parakeet and two Jay seen most visits. Two Coal Tit were singing around Russia Dock Woodland on 5<sup>th</sup>. Long-tail Tit, as in other places, have paired off and seen throughout the month. On 29<sup>th</sup> a Willow Warbler was singing near the Hop Garden and by the end of the month four Chiffchaff and three Blackcap were singing. Two Goldcrest were heard and the Song Thrush started Singing again on 19<sup>th</sup>. Rotherhithe's one and only wintering Redwing was seen for the last time on 5<sup>th</sup>. After a promising autumn start it turned into a poor turn out for winter thrushes. 10 House Sparrow were around Globe Pond and a pair of Chaffinch were near Mahogany Pond on 12<sup>th</sup>, also five Goldfinch.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> On 19<sup>th</sup> a pair of **Canada Goose** dropped in and within minutes the male **Mute Swan** mobbed them until they left. One **Egyptian Goose** has been present for some time although there was a pair on 5<sup>th</sup>. On 29<sup>th</sup> a male **Pochard** was with **Tufted Duck** (between 30 and 40 throughout) 12 **Black-headed Gull** were seen on 5<sup>th</sup> but most left soon after. On 29<sup>th</sup> a **Chiffchaff** was singing along Deal Porters Way and a **Willow Warbler**, the first for the year, sang briefly on the other side of the dock.

<u>Canada Water:</u> 14 Tufted Duck on 15<sup>th</sup> along with Pied Wagtail, four Black-headed Gull, two Herring Gull and a Cormorant remained by 23<sup>rd</sup>, also pair of Grey Wagtail.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> A pair of Egyptian Goose was at Greenland Dock on 15<sup>th</sup> but there are at least two other pairs in the area, one in the channel leading to South Dock had at least 4 young. 20+ Tufted Duck were seen on 15<sup>th</sup>, along with one Great Crested Grebe which was also seen on 29<sup>th</sup>. On 15<sup>th</sup> there were 40+ Black-headed Gull, 8 Herring Gull and a Common Gull, most had left by the following week and on 29<sup>th</sup> not a single gull was to be found away from the river.

<u>Thames at Rotherhithe:</u> Notable sightings were a pair of **Stock Dove** at Durand's Wharf on 15<sup>th</sup> and two **Sand Martin** flying upriver at Salt Quay on 31<sup>st</sup>.

<u>Bermondsey:</u> On 27<sup>th</sup> A **Collared Dove** started calling along St James' Road, this has become a regular spot over the last few years. A **Grey Heron** went over toward Southwark Park on 20<sup>th</sup>. On 27<sup>th</sup> a female **Sparrowhawk** took a **House Sparrow** in a garden. A **Grey Wagtail** went over on 20<sup>th</sup> and up to three **Ringed-neck Parakeets** were seen or heard most days. **Goldfinch** was also seen on several days as flyover, but the bird of the month for this location was a **Greenfinch** over Bermondsey Station, once a regular breeder during 1980s, this is the first one that I have seen here for many years.

# February 2025

Southwark Park: Waterfowl numbers have been low throughout the month with 7 Canada Goose and one Egyptian Goose on 25<sup>th</sup>, Tufted Duck have been infrequent visitors with a high count of 5 on 17<sup>th</sup>. On 22<sup>nd</sup> the male Mandarin Duck returned after an absence of about two years, but only stayed the day. We found three Stock Dove. with one calling, at the North side on 25<sup>th</sup>. One Little Grebe was seen on several visits. Black-headed Gull numbers remained around 40, many have brown heads now and by mid-March they will be heading off to their breeding colonies. While we had two Grey Heron at the start of the month only one was seen later and none after 17<sup>th</sup>. A pair of Jay were seen on 3<sup>rd</sup> along the Carriage Drive. Coal Tit was singing most of the month although this single has been ranging from the North side to the sports ground on the South side. On 25<sup>th</sup> a Chiffchaff was singing at The Lake, our first this year and, no doubt one of our overwintering birds. A Song Thrush sang from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> near The Lake before moving on. Hopefully the pair of Mistle Thrush, seen on 25<sup>th</sup>, will breed this year. Other notable sightings: 26 Starling on 22<sup>nd</sup>, 7 Blackbird on 8<sup>th</sup>, Goldcrest and Longtailed Tit. On 7<sup>th</sup> the part leucistic male Blackbird was seen by a local birder near the Bowling Green.

<u>King's Stairs Garden:</u> No notable passerines but on 17<sup>th</sup> we counted 150+ **Black-headed Gull**, 2 **Common Gull** and 45+ **Cormorant** on the barges, many of them in breeding plumage.

Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond: 6 Canada Goose and a Greylag went over on 12<sup>th</sup>, 12 Mallard were on Globe Pond on 26<sup>th</sup>, also on 26<sup>th</sup> we saw the male Tufted Duck fly in with Mallard, now believe that this male is the orphaned bird that attached to a Mallard brood. A Collared Dove was in Russia Dock Woodland on 12<sup>th</sup>. Gull numbers were, as usual low, with 4 Black-headed Gull and 2 Lesser Black-backed Gull on 12<sup>th</sup>. One Cormorant and Grey Heron were on Globe Pond on 5<sup>th</sup>. On 19<sup>th</sup> a Sparrowhawk was chased by two Carrion Crow through Stave Hill Ecology Park. 2 Great Spotted Woodpecker throughout the month with one drumming in Russia Dock Woodland. Long-tailed Tit have dispersed although we found a group of 5 on 12<sup>th</sup>. One Chiffchaff was found on 5<sup>th</sup> and on 12<sup>th</sup> we counted 11 Wren from Joe's Pond near Salter Road to Onega Gate, there are, no doubt several others lurking. We also found 5 Blackbird, 3 Goldcrest and the male Song Thrush is still singing. On 5<sup>th</sup> we found 6 Dunnock, quite often we see only one or two. They are always there, just not always obvious. 4 Goldfinch were at Bea Pond on 19<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> Mute Swan pair are starting to nest build; 2 Egyptian Goose were seen on 26<sup>th</sup>. Tufted Duck numbers remained stable with 42 on 17<sup>th</sup>, Black-headed Gull numbers were likewise unchanged with c50 throughout. One Common Gull remained throughout along with 3 Lesser Black-backed Gull and up to 3 Cormorant. The best find in this area was a pair of Chaffinch along Deal Porters Way. We also had 5 Goldfinch over.

<u>Canada Water:</u> 14 Tufted Duck was the highest count on 17<sup>th</sup>. Up to 40 Black-headed Gull along with one Common Gull and one Pied Wagtail, flyover, on 8<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> Not much on the wildfowl front going on; usual suspects of **Mute Swan** (pair were displaying 25<sup>th</sup>) **Canada Goose** (4), **Egyptian Goose**, **Mallard** and up to 40 **Tufted Duck** throughout the month. On 5<sup>th</sup> we found a freshly killed **Feral Pigeon** floating in South Dock, the spray of feathers and wound had all the hall marks of a **Peregrine** strike gone wrong. One **Great Crested Grebe** was seen on several days. 60+ **Blackheaded Gull**, 2 **Common Gull**, 7 **Herring Gull**, 6 **Lesser Black-backed Gull** were the highest counts during the month. Only one **Cormorant** was seen on 25<sup>th</sup>. Other notable species were **Great Spotted Woodpecker**, 1 **Chiffchaff** and 2 **Goldfinch** on 5<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Bermondsey:</u> Only one notable entry this month - a **Robin** fledgling photographed at Spa Road on  $2^{nd}$ . This seems remarkably early and means that the eggs were laid mid-January at least.

# January 2025

<u>Southwark Park:</u> A pair of **Shoveler** remained until 9<sup>th</sup>. **Tufted Duck** were also low with a pair dropping in for a few days until 17<sup>th</sup>. A **Stock Dove** over on 17<sup>th</sup> was our first sighting for several weeks. A **Little Grebe** was spotted from 7<sup>Th</sup>. **Black-headed Gull** remained around 60 for most of the month, we also had 3 **Lesser Black-back Gull** and a **Herring Gull**. On 2<sup>nd</sup> the **Great Black-backed Gull** returned and was seen again on 7<sup>th</sup>, perhaps the same bird seen over Stave Hill. The resident pair of **Grey Heron** were briefly joined by another pair that flew in, circled for a couple of minutes then headed toward Deptford. **Coal Tit** was singing most days in the north part of the park. Other notable sightings: 4 **Long-tailed Tit**, 2 **Goldcrest**, 2 **Mistle Thrush**, 9 **Blackbird**, 4 **Goldfinch** and 5 **Starling** (there seem to be hardly any throughout Rotherhithe this winter and it appears that a colony near Rouel Estate, Bermondsey has disappeared)

Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond: A pair of Canada Goose returned to Globe Pond on 8<sup>th</sup>. Hopefully they will have a safe season this year. 2 Mute Swan went over on 8<sup>th</sup> and the male Tufted Duck remained throughout, mostly on Globe Pond. On 29<sup>th</sup> we found a pair of Stock Dove in Russia Dock Woodland. Single Collared Dove were seen on 8<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>, still a scarce species in the area. Gulls have been few and far between; mostly singles of Black-headed, Herring and Lesser Black-backed with a notable Great Black-backed Gull over on 15<sup>th</sup>. An immature Cormorant has, along with Grey Heron, been a regular visitor to Globe Pond. Great Spotted Woodpecker were active during the month with plenty of drumming. 2 Jay were seen on 29<sup>th</sup>. Most Long-tailed Tit have dispersed with a high count of 5 together on 15<sup>th</sup>. Only one Chiffchaff has remained and on 15<sup>th</sup> we found 3 Goldcrest. Song

**Thrush** started singing by 8<sup>th</sup>, this male has been moving around ranging from Long Meadow to Downtown Pond. On 29<sup>th</sup> a single **Redwing** was found in the woods by Long Meadow. 4 **Goldfinch** and **Pied Wagtail** on 25<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> 11 Canada Goose dropped in on 25<sup>th</sup>, one Egyptian Goose and 5 Mute Swan throughout the month. 50-70 Tufted Duck remained. Maximum gull numbers were 80+ Blackheaded Gull on 8<sup>th</sup> one Common Gull most of the month along with a pair of Lesser Blackbacked Gull. We found 4 Long-tailed Tit on 8<sup>th</sup> while a Coal Tit singing on 29<sup>th</sup> was a new species for us from this area. Also Great Spotted Woodpecker.

<u>Canada Water:</u> One Common Gull amongst 40+ Black-headed Gull on 8<sup>th</sup>. A pair of Egyptian Goose have taken up residence, probably in competition with the Mute Swan pair. 12 Tufted Duck and a Cormorant on 25<sup>th</sup> along with a Pied Wagtail flyover.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> 15 Greylag were on Greenland Dock on 25<sup>th</sup>, c40 Tufted Duck for most of the month. Two Collared Dove went over on 22<sup>nd</sup>. Also on 22<sup>nd</sup> we found pair of Great Crested Grebe, one on Greenland Dock and the other on South Dock. We found 6 Cormorant, most adults in full breeding plumage with two immature birds. Also on South Dock we found a Shag, a rarity in the London area. Around 50 Black-headed Gull, 2 Common Gull, 4 Lesser Black-backed Gull and 3 Herring Gull were found on 25<sup>th</sup>. A Grey Wagtail and 4 Goldfinch were also seen on 25<sup>th</sup>.

# 2024

## December 2024

<u>Southwark Park:</u> The male **Egyptian Goose** has been on guard for some time and on 27<sup>th</sup> we spotted the pair with 7 young (the latest brood that I have seen) By 30<sup>th</sup> they had been taken, probably by Grey Heron. On 14<sup>th</sup> three **Canada Goose**, along with a pair of **Gadwall**, our only record this month. **Shoveler** numbers have also been low with a high of five on 30<sup>th</sup>. On 9<sup>th</sup> there were 15 **Mallard**, most of which were males. On 23<sup>rd</sup> we found one **Little Grebe**, our first sighting for a couple of months. **Black-headed Gull** numbers remained around 45 throughout with one **Herring Gull** and 2 **Lesser Black-backed Gull**. A pair of **Grey Heron** are now resident on The Lake. With the ongoing work on MaydewHouse we only had one **Peregrine** sighting, on 27<sup>th</sup>. 10 **Starling** were on the sports field on 19<sup>th</sup>. Also present on several days was a **Mistle Thrush**. Other notable species were **Great Spotted Woodpecker**, 4 **Goldcrest** and 2 **Coal Tit**.

King's Stairs Garden: Notable in this area was at least 3 Common Gull on the river on 31st.

<u>Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond:</u> A male <u>Tufted Duck</u> remained on Globe Pond most of the month, <u>Kingfisher</u> was seen at Downtown Pond on 11<sup>th</sup> but was not seen after this date, perhaps it was the one seen on Greenland Dock on 14<sup>th</sup>. A **Grey Heron** was at

Globe Pond most days and on 11<sup>th</sup> an Immature **Cormorant** dropped in for the morning. On 17<sup>th</sup> we found a party of 17 **Long-tailed Tit**, with them were **Blue Tit** and **Great Tit** but all those **Chiffchaff** have dispersed and we only found singles. Two **Goldcrest** were found during the month. On 11<sup>th</sup> we found a **Song Thrush**. On 31<sup>st</sup> this bird had started singing. Other notable species were **Great Spotted Woodpecker** most days and **Jay** on 31<sup>st</sup>.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> On 31<sup>st</sup> we saw 62 Tufted Duck, 1 Egyptian Goose, 5 Mute Swan, 53 Blackheaded Gull and one Common Gull.

<u>Canada Water:</u> A check through 85 **Black-headed Gull** on 31<sup>st</sup> revealed a **Common Gull** amongst them. 3 **Mute Swan**, 10 **Tufted Duck**, **Cormorant** and **Grey Wagtail** were also seen.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> On 14<sup>th</sup> a **Kingfisher** was seen by a local birder. On 31<sup>st</sup> we found 4 **Mute Swan**, 2 **Egyptian Goose**, 50 **Tufted Duck**, 70+ **Black-headed Gull**, 13 **Herring Gull**, one **Common Gull** and 7 **Cormorant**.

**Bermondsey:** 2 **Common Gull** on 9<sup>th</sup> over Market Place was a good record, a scarce species in the area with few records away from the river. 25 **Black-headed Gull** were on the green at Rouel Estate on 6<sup>th</sup>. On 9<sup>th</sup> 5 **Greylag** went over with a single over on 29<sup>th</sup>. **Grey Wagtail** was seen or heard most days. Also 5 **Ring-necked Parakeet** along St James' Road on 29<sup>th</sup>.

## November 2024

Southwark Park: 39 Canada Goose arrived on 11<sup>th</sup> along with two Greylag but did not hang around for long. On 8<sup>th</sup> a pair of Shoveler were our first of the winter, three were on The Lake on 30<sup>th</sup>. 10 Gadwall were present on 12<sup>th</sup> but left soon after, also regular was a female Tufted Duck. 30 Woodpigeon were counted on 8<sup>th</sup>. We did well with gulls this month with up to 50 Black-headed Gull, 4 Herring Gull, 2 Lesser Black-backed Gull, a Common Gull on 12<sup>th</sup>, and a Great Black-backed Gull on 19<sup>th</sup> was a first that I for me. Up to 3 Cormorant were around most of the month with a maximum of 6 on 4<sup>th</sup>. 2 Grey Heron present most of the month. A Sparrowhawk over on 28<sup>th</sup> and two Great Spotted Woodpecker were regularly seen or heard, only one Peregrine sighting throughout the month with a single on 4<sup>th</sup>. A Coal Tit was heard a couple of times and a Chiffchaff was with a party of Long-tailed Tit on 30<sup>th</sup>, 6 Goldcrest were found on 8<sup>th</sup> in various parts of the park. One Starling at the sports ground and 2 Mistle Thrush on 28<sup>th</sup>.

<u>King's Stairs Garden:</u> Apart from up to 20 **Mute Swan** on the north side of the river and two **Common Gull** on the Surrey side on 30<sup>th</sup>, all was mostly quiet.

**Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond:** On 27<sup>th</sup> two **Canada Goose** over toward Greenland Dock. 10 or so **Mallard** are normal for us but on 14<sup>th</sup> we found 30 on Globe Pond alone! Most of these must have been passing through as numbers dropped by the end of the month. A male **Tufted Duck**, usually on Globe Pond, was on Downtown Pond on 27<sup>th</sup>. On 20<sup>th</sup> we found a female **Kingfisher** at Downtown Pond, also **Sparrowhawk**. On 2<sup>nd</sup> we found 22 **Woodpigeon** and on 14<sup>th</sup> we counted 24 **Moorhen** between Downtown and Globe Ponds. Few gulls went through during the month, mostly the usual species (**Black-headed, Herring** 

and Lesser Black-backed) but a Great Black-backed Gull over on the 27<sup>th</sup> was a good record. 9 Cormorant went over on 2<sup>nd</sup> and the usual Grey Heron was on Globe Pond most of the month. On 27<sup>th</sup> we found a large mixed party of Long-tailed Tit, Blue Tit, Great Tit, Goldcrest and at least 6 Chiffchaff (a lot for this time of the year for us) and may be the group seen several weeks ago. On 2<sup>nd</sup> 14 Redwing went through and 4 remained on 14<sup>th</sup>. Also on 14<sup>th</sup> we had a single Lesser Redpoll and the only Chaffinch was on 2<sup>nd</sup>. Other highlights: 10 Ringnecked Parakeet through on 14<sup>th</sup>, pair of Great Spotted Woodpecker, Jay, 2 Firecrest and, two Coal Tit on 20<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> On 30<sup>th</sup> there were 18 Canada Goose, 2 Greylag, 5 Mute Swan (with a further 10 over from the river), 28 Mallard, 85 Tufted Duck, 6 Moorhen, 6 Coot, 40 Black-headed Gull and 7 Cormorant. 10 Starling were on the gasworks, very low winter count. A Grey Wagtail was seen on 2<sup>nd</sup>.

<u>Canada Water:</u> On 30<sup>th</sup> a single **Canada Goose** was being chased and mobbed by the resident **Mute Swan** family (3). No small passerines were recorded at the water but at nearby Albion Channel: **House Sparrow, Blue Tit, Goldfinch. Tufted Duck** numbers are usually low here these days but on 30<sup>th</sup> we counted 48. Also 2 **Egyptian Goose**. 3 **Cormorant**, 66 **Black-headed Gull** and 2 **Herring Gull** were seen on 12<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> 6 Mute Swan and 2 Egyptian Goose present throughout. On 6<sup>th</sup> there were 55 Tufted Duck and 2 Great Crested Grebe along with 40 Blackheaded Gull and 20 Herring Gull. On 30<sup>th</sup> we found 5 Common Gull and 8 Cormorant - our highest count this month. On 7<sup>th</sup> 25 Greylag dropped in.

**Bermondsey:** A **Grey Wagtail** over on 25<sup>th</sup>.

## October 2024

Southwark Park: 16 Canada Goose and a Greylag arrived on 15<sup>th</sup>, 2 Egyptian Goose and 12 Mallard were present throughout. Gadwall numbers remained low with a max of 8 on 22<sup>nd</sup>. A female Tufted Duck present most days was joined by a male on 4<sup>th</sup>. A Stock Dove on 4<sup>th</sup> was our only record this month and there was little Wood Pigeon migration over the park. Blackheaded Gull numbers were low with 20 on The Lake on 22<sup>nd</sup> along with one Herring Gull and a Lesser Black-backed Gull. While Jay, on 4<sup>th</sup>, was a good record for us the real prize was a flock of 20 Jackdaw on 22<sup>nd</sup>, previous records are of three individuals, two at Stave Hill and one in the park. 15 House Martin passing over on the 7<sup>th</sup> were heading SW and was our last record for the area. A party of Long-tailed Tit on 15<sup>th</sup> had a Chiffchaff tagging along, also least 7 Goldcrest around the park. With the first Redwing arriving during the first two weeks we had 12 on 15<sup>th</sup> and 6 on 19<sup>th</sup>. A Chaffinch on 22<sup>nd</sup> was our only finch passing through. Other notable records were 6 Cormorant on 4<sup>th</sup>, Peregrine most days, Grey Heron and Great Spotted Woodpecker, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail and Coal Tit. On 7<sup>th</sup> a part leucistic male Blackbird was at Ada Salter Garden.

**<u>King's Stairs Garden:</u>** Jay crossing the river on 15<sup>th</sup> was our only notable bird.

Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond: On 7th a Yellow-browed Warbler was found in Russia Dock Woodland near Salter Road but was soon lost. We saw little of the mass **Wood Pigeon** migration with a high count of 180+ on the morning of 23<sup>rd</sup>. A brief sighting of Kingfisher on 2<sup>nd</sup> was the only record during the month. On 5<sup>th</sup> 4 Mute Swan flew North as did 20 Canada Goose on 12th. At least 2 Jay were seen this month. 12 Moorhen were on Globe Pond and another 5 were on Downtown Pond. Grey Heron was seen most days. A male Tufted **Duck** has been regular at Globe Pond. Vismig on 5<sup>th</sup> was very productive: **Green Sandpiper** (a new patch tick), Great Black-backed Gull, Coal Tit, Blackcap, 4 Song Thrush, Mistle Thrush, 20 Redwing, 2 Lesser Redpoll, Siskin, Chaffinch, 30 Magpie gathered in the treetops around Globe Pond and finally 14 Swallow though low surpassed all past records. 10 Herring Gull and 15 Black-headed Gull were over on 3rd while 2 Lesser Black-backed Gull were seen most days. 6 **Cormorant** went over toward Greenland Dock on 12<sup>th</sup>. There was good **Redwing** passage this year with another 80+ on 12<sup>th</sup> and 150+ on 16<sup>th</sup>. Further early morning sessions gave us 8 Blackbird, 2 Grey Wagtail, 9 Pied Wagtail, 3 Meadow Pipit, 2 Chaffinch, 2 Greenfinch, 6 Goldfinch and our 2<sup>nd</sup> Hawfinch over Stave Hill on 12<sup>th</sup>. The London Bird Club walk on 13<sup>th</sup> turned up 2 Collared Dove, Cetti's Warbler and Firecrest. On 23rd 10+ Ring-necked Parakeet went through, there only appears to be two or three on site. Great Spotted Woodpecker and Sparrowhawk were seen most days. At least two Coal Tit were seen several times but we did not get a passage through this year although there were at least 6 Goldcrest in the area. A large party of Long-tailed Tit contained at least 20 individuals with up to 10 Chiffchaff amongst them. 9 House Martin went over on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4 on 5<sup>th</sup> was our last record. A probable, but unseen, owl was mobbed by Carrion Crow and Magpies on 9<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> 24 Canada Goose dropped in on 2nd, with them was a single Greylag, this latter is no doubt the Globe Pond male paired with a Canada Goose. This is the first time that we have seen Greylag on this water. 7 **Mute Swan** and 2 **Egyptian Goose** were present throughout, 30+ **Tufted Duck** were seen on 5<sup>th</sup>. One **Lesser Black-backed Gull** was seen on 2<sup>nd</sup> and two were seen on 13<sup>th</sup>. A **Grey Heron** on 5<sup>th</sup> was an unusual record here, it's behaviour was equally odd – it dived into the water from one of the floating platforms.

<u>Canada Water:</u> Very little happening here, water levels are rising and soon the Red Bridge will open. 4 **Tufted Duck** were seen most days.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> On 10<sup>th</sup> we found 2 **Great Crested Grebe**, 6 **Mute Swan**, 50 **Tufted Duck**, 70+ **Black-headed Gull**, one **Herring Gull** was the only other species seen, 25 **Cormorant**, these can often be seen later in the morning from Stave Hill heading for Greenland Dock. On 21<sup>st</sup> I was sent a photo of an **Egyptian Goose** with a new brood of three young.

<u>Bermondsey:</u> A Redwing over on 5<sup>th</sup> marked the first of the returning winter thrushes. On 16<sup>th</sup> another 150+ went over, this was part of the main migration that took place during the next few days. A **Sparrowhawk** was over Rouel Estate on 12<sup>th</sup>, also 2 **Jay**. A friend told me that a couple of weeks ago a **Pheasant** flew into the Post Office canteen at Mandela Way and fatally struck a window.

<u>Southwark Park:</u> On 12<sup>th</sup> 8 Canada Goose arrived and 12 Greylag went over. On 7<sup>th</sup> 2 Gadwall arrived and 7 were on The Lake by 30<sup>th</sup>, also two Tufted Duck. Two Stock Dove were seen on 7<sup>th</sup> and a flock of 21 Wood Pigeon were feeding on the north side on 30<sup>th</sup>, including a leucistic individual. Peregrine was seen regularly with the trio on 10<sup>th</sup> chasing Feral Pigeon. 5 House Martin were on The Lake on 5<sup>th</sup> and a mixed tit flock near Ada Salter Garden held Blue Tit, Great Tit, 6 Long-tailed Tit and 4 Chiffchaff. A single Goldfinch over on 30<sup>th</sup> was the first for some time. Other notable species: Great Spotted Woodpecker, Jay, Mistle Thrush, Sparrowhawk and Goldcrest.

<u>King's Stairs Garden:</u> On 12<sup>th</sup> an adult **Yellow-legged Gull** was on one of the barges, perhaps this was the Bermondsey bird of some weeks back. Also 100+ **Black-headed Gull**, 2 **Great Black-backed Gull** and **Grey Wagtail**.

Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond: A male Kestrel briefly over The Shed on 4<sup>th</sup> was a major prize for us, this is now a very scarce bird in the area. On 6<sup>th</sup> a Sparrowhawk (female/immature) found dead near Bacon College, it had been decapitated and possibly killed by a Peregrine. Our resident female has been seen several times during the month. Three Tufted Duck were still on Globe Pond on 11<sup>th</sup>. On 17<sup>th</sup> there was a good passage of warblers with 10 Chiffchaff (4 were found on 4<sup>th</sup>) and 2 Willow Warbler; a Little Egret over Globe Pond was a good record; we don't get many through. One Blackcap was found on 4<sup>th</sup>. On 26<sup>th</sup> a Firecrest turned up in Central Meadow and a Cetti's Warbler returned to one of the ponds. Coal Tit was seen several times during the month and parties of Long-tailed Tit are starting to gather.

<u>Surrey Water:</u> Tufted Duck numbers are gradually going up with 54 on 30<sup>th</sup>. Up to 30 Blackheaded Gull were also seen 30<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Canada Water:</u> Gradually water level is rising; 40+ **Black-headed Gull,** one **Cormorant,** 30 **Mallard** and 6 **Tufted Duck** were seen during the month.

<u>Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock:</u> The <u>Great Crested Grebe</u> have been elusive during the month. <u>Mute Swan</u> with 4 cygnets still on Greenland Dock. A large party of **Longtailed Tit** were reported from Norway Dock area on 30<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Bermondsey:</u> 2 **Swallow** went over south on 11<sup>th</sup>, only my second record here. Also a **Chiffchaff** passed through on 14<sup>th</sup>. A **Goldcrest** was calling in Monnow Road on 28<sup>th</sup>.

# August 2024

## **Southwark Park**

26 **Canada Goose** with a single **Greylag** were on The Lake on 26<sup>th</sup>. The Greylag is the male paired with a Canada Goose and they returned with three young all of which look like Canada Goose. They used to breed on Globe Pond but they are not seen in Rotherhithe during the breeding season, so perhaps they breed at Burgess Park. Two **Egyptian Goose** throughout the

month. Three **Stock Dove** in the north side on 8<sup>th</sup> and 29 **Wood Pigeon** were on the playing field on 22<sup>nd</sup>. Up to 2 **Little Grebe** were found during the month, also an adult **Grey Heron** was a regular visitor. On 26<sup>th</sup> pair of **Peregrine** with youngster were together for the first time this month, the young bird was feeding on a Feral Pigeon although we have also found remains of Wood Pigeon. Few **House Martin** sightings over the park with one on 12<sup>th</sup> and 4 on 26<sup>th</sup>. A **Mistle Thrush** on 12<sup>th</sup> was our first sighting for some time, now a very scarce species in the area with possibly 2 pairs and no signs of breeding this year. Other notable species: **Great Spotted Woodpecker** and **Goldcrest.** 

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

On 21<sup>st</sup> 6 Canada Goose headed north over the reserve. 11 young Tufted Duck remain on Globe Pond, also in the area was a Stock Dove and regular Grey Heron. Up to three Lesser Black-backed Gull and singles of Herring Gull were over. A female Sparrowhawk has been seen regularly hunting over Stave Hill (likely same one from Bermondsey and Norway Dock), no male has moved into the area so far. Two Jay have been regular around Russia Dock Woodland along with four Ring-necked Parakeet. The star bird this month was a Swallow heading south along Albion Channel toward Canada Water. This is our only record this year (see note in Other News). Up to 12 House Martin continued to feed over the area until the end of the month. A party of Long-tailed Tit of up to 12 adults and juveniles was around Globe Pond on 21<sup>st</sup>. Three Chiffchaff (one singing) and 2 Blackcap were found on 28<sup>th</sup>.

# **Surrey Water**

The Mute Swan family with 7 young remain along with 2 Egyptian Goose, 12 Mallard and 11 Tufted Duck. 17 Black-headed Gull were seen on 7<sup>th</sup>, also 2 Cormorant. 5 House Martin also on 21<sup>st</sup> and a Jay around Deal Porters.

## **Canada Water**

30+ Black-headed Gull and a Cormorant were amongst the Usual Suspects.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

5 **Great Crested Grebe** were between Greenland and South Dock. On 22<sup>nd</sup> 16 **Mute Swan** including resident pair with 4 cygnets were on Greenland Dock, this is a record number for us, most left by 25<sup>th</sup>. **Sparrowhawk** has also been regular around Norway Dock during the month.

## Bermondsey

On 13<sup>th</sup> we had one of our rare **Mute Swan** flyovers. A **Collared Dove** flew up St James' Road on 11<sup>th</sup> and foraging **Feral Pigeon** at Rouel Estate have fallen fowl to a smart **Herring Gull** taking advantage of the regular feeding to hunt them. A female **Sparrowhawk** was over a couple of times. I believe that this is the same individual mentioned above. A pair of **Ringnecked Parakeet** are regular and on 11<sup>th</sup> a pair of **Jay** were near Bermondsey Station.

## **July 2024**

#### **Southwark Park**

16 Canada Goose were on The Lake over the month along with up to 4 Egyptian Goose. A pair of Tufted Duck were seen on the 8<sup>th</sup>. A pair of Peregrine with a juvenile returned regularly; the young bird was seen feeding on Feral Pigeon on several occasions. At least one Stock Dove was in the southern end of the park and a Collared Dove was seen around Ada Salter Garden most days. On 8<sup>th</sup> we discovered that the Little Grebe had 3 young, one was lost but the remaining two doing very well at the end of the month. Although Black-headed Gull have been returning for several weeks the first for the park was not seen until 25<sup>th</sup> when one was on The Lake. On 23<sup>rd</sup> two Cormorant arrived but only stayed for a day. At the start of the month the young Grey Heron was seen around The Lake but moved soon after. 7 Ringed-necked Parakeet, of which three were recently fledged, were seen most days. A pair of Jay were seen on 23<sup>rd</sup> and a Coal Tit was singing on 8<sup>th</sup> and again on 29<sup>th</sup>. Also on 8<sup>th</sup> was a party of Long-tailed Tit around The Lake. 6 House Martin moved through on 16<sup>th</sup>. One Mistle Thrush was seen several times, no sign of any breeding this year. Other notable species were Blackcap and Goldcrest.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

**Tufted Duck** have had a good season on Globe Pond this year with 7 females seen on 24<sup>th</sup> amongst which we counted 17 young of various ages. **Swift** were seen on several days usually 2 or 3 although 5 were seen on 10<sup>th</sup>. On 24<sup>th</sup> a mixed gull flock passed through in late morning; we counted 70+ **Black-headed Gull**, 25+ **Herring Gull** and 6 **Lesser Black-backed Gull**. On 17<sup>th</sup> a **Common Buzzard** was over Globe Pond. **House Martin** numbers varied from 12+ on 10th to 5 on 24<sup>th</sup>. On 27<sup>th</sup> 20+ were seen feeding over the nearby Surrey Quays Leisure Park. **Blackcap** are hard work now since most males have stopped singing but we did find one on 31<sup>st</sup>. 4 **Chiffchaff** were also found on 31<sup>st</sup>. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> we discovered that **Reed Warbler** had bred on a nearby section of Albion Channel. We found an adult with 2 fledglings. Great news, since we were not sure what was going on with the male that sang at different points of the channel not so long ago. A relief to see that we have not lost this species due to the current redevelopment of Canada Water where it had been a regular breeder since the late 1970s. Other notables were 2 **Jay, Grey Heron, Great Spotted Woodpecker**, 2 **Stock Dove** and one **Collared Dove**, the latter is still very scarce in the area.

## **Surrey Water**

The **Mute Swan** family with 7 young have been the most successful in the area, none have returned to Southwark Park and the Greenland Dock pair have lost 4 young. 2 **Egyptian Goose**, 12 **Mallard** and 8 **Tufted Duck** (14 earlier in the month) were seen on 30<sup>th</sup>. 15+ **House Martin** were seen along the river along with one **Swift**, 10 were over Surrey Water on 14<sup>th</sup>.

## **Canada Water**

29 **Black-headed Gull** gathered on 30<sup>th</sup>, only 6 present at start of the month. One **Cormorant** was also seen on 30<sup>th</sup>. Records of **House Sparrow**, **Wren** and **Great Tit** were from the lower end of Albion Channel, so far we have not found these species amongst the new plantings.

## **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

Our concerns for the **Great Crested Grebe** were put to rest when the pair revealed that they had two chicks on 4<sup>th</sup>. They had been hiding somewhere on South Dock. To add to this a third adult was also seen. A **Grey Wagtail** was seen on 16<sup>th</sup>, On 30<sup>th</sup> were found 43 **Black-headed Gull**, 2 **Lesser Black-backed Gull** and 9 **Egyptian Goose**. The **Mute Swan** were seen with 4

young although we were told that they have also lost 4. On 24<sup>th</sup> 100+ **Starling** were reported over Norway Dock and a **Sparrowhawk** was also seen on 30<sup>th</sup>.

# Bermondsey

Up to 6 House Martin were over most days. 2 Jay were seen near Bermondsey Tube on 31st.

## June 2024

#### **Southwark Park**

On 1<sup>st</sup> 4 **Greylag** arrived but only stayed for the day, very few Greylag have been visiting the park since last year. 15 **Canada Goose** with 5 young and 4 **Egyptian Goose** were also seen. A pair of **Tufted Duck** remained for several days leaving on 11<sup>th</sup>. On 9<sup>th</sup> the male **Pochard** returned for the day. On 5<sup>th</sup> we found **Stock Dove** near the China Hall entrance, this means that we have at least three territories throughout the park. On 7<sup>th</sup> a **Collared Dove** flew over. The young **Grey Heron** looks as though it will soon leave the nest. A **Coal Tit** was around The Lake on 7<sup>th</sup> and up to three **Blackcap** were singing up to 20<sup>th</sup>. 20+ **Starling** were on the sports track on 22<sup>nd</sup>, this flock included at least 4 juveniles. A **Greenfinch** on 11<sup>th</sup> was our first in the park for ages. Other highlights were **Peregrine** and **Mistle Thrush**.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

On 19<sup>th</sup> a pair of **Tufted Duck** and **Grey Heron** were on Globe Pond. We also found 3 **Stock Dove**, **Jay**, a family party of **Long-tailed Tit**, three **Chiffchaff** and one **Blackcap** were singing at the end of the month. Hardly any **House Martin** are feeding over Stave Hill/Russia Dock Woodland with three over on 5<sup>th</sup>.

## **Lavender Pond**

On 19<sup>th</sup> we found a **Tufted Duck** with two young.

# **Surrey Water**

16 **Tufted Duck** on 19<sup>th</sup> along with one **Egyptian Goose**, and a pair of **Grey Wagtail** with two fledglings. Over the river we found 8 **House Martin** and one **Swift** (3 were seen on 18<sup>th</sup>). Along Deal Porters we had **Great Spotted Woodpecker** and **Collared Dove**.

# **Canada Water**

Apart from the usual suspects, we heard a **Reed Warbler** singing at the mouth of the Albion Channel on 5<sup>th</sup> and remained until 19<sup>th</sup>. Other highlights were 3 **House Martin, Lesser Black-backed Gull** and **Grey Heron** on 5<sup>th</sup>.

## **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

A **Great Crested Grebe** was seen on South Dock and another was seen on Greenland Dock during the month.

# Bermondsey

The first **Swift**, two, in the area were seen on 2<sup>nd</sup>, 5 were over on 20<sup>th</sup>, and two were seen with around 15 **House Martin** over Bermondsey Station on 26<sup>th</sup>. We made an interesting

discovery on the Rouel Estate green on 18<sup>th</sup>; an adult **Yellow-legged Gull** had joined several **Herring Gull** and **Lesser Black-backed Gull** taking offered bread. On 22<sup>nd</sup> a **Peregrine** was over Rouel Estate and on 29<sup>th</sup> another Peregrine with a juvenile was over Market Square. On 18<sup>th</sup> 2 **Starling** went over. There used to be a good population on Rouel Estate but this seems to have disappeared, there should be groups of adults and screeching juveniles feeding on the green.

# May 2024

#### **Southwark Park**

Grey Heron has bred for the first time. A nest that has been mostly out of sight was seen midmonth with one chick that appeared to be at least 2 weeks old. We have contacted the BTO Heronry registry and are waiting for further updates. Up to 6 **Tufted Duck** at the start of the month but only one pair at the end. 2 **Egyptian Goose** have been around for months but no signs of breeding this year. 15 **Starling** were at the sports ground on 13<sup>th</sup>, a **Sparrowhawk** was mobbed by crows over The Lake and a **Peregrine** was hunting pigeons around Maydew House on 27<sup>th</sup>. At least one **Collared Dove** was seen several times during the month. On 27<sup>th</sup> a **Reed Warbler** dropped in and sang for the day. The 31<sup>st</sup> saw the return of **Pochard** pair for a few hours, also our first **Greylag**, two, for many months. Other highlights were singing **Goldcrest**, 2 **Mistle Thrush** over, 6 **Stock Dove** and singing **Coal Tit** on 24<sup>th</sup>.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

On 1<sup>st</sup> 11 **Tufted Duck** dropped in and two remained for most of the month. The **Canada Goose** pair was still on site but the female was still clearly distressed from her recent dog encounter. One **Willow Warbler** and two **Chiffchaff** were heard. 6 **Greenfinch** near Stave Hill Pond, an excellent record for this time of the year. On 5<sup>th</sup> we met up for the annual **Sound Camp Dawn Chorus** starting at 04:30. We logged 30 species that included **Jay, Great Spotted Woodpecker**, 6 **Blackcap** singing, **Goldfinch** and one **Greenfinch**. Two **Oystercatcher** over Durand's Wharf was an excellent local record and a new patch tick. A **Grey Wagtail** was seen at Globe Pond on 8th, this was a female actively collecting insects to feed young, great to see this as a breeding species in the area again. A **Collared Dove** was singing at The Shed. **Longtailed Tit** can now be seen in family groups of fledged young; a party of 6 young was seen at Globe Pond. On 1<sup>st</sup> a pair of **Mistle Thrush** were on The Green, Russia Dock Woodland and from 5<sup>th</sup> a **Song Thrush** started singing at Stave Hill Ecology Park from 5<sup>th</sup>. Another notable species over Stave Hill was a **Great Black-backed Gull** on 8<sup>th</sup>.

# **Surrey Water**

On 5<sup>th</sup> at least 5 **House Martin** were seen at the Salt Quay colony with up to 10 seen on 11<sup>th</sup>. A **Common Sandpiper** was on the river near Durand's Wharf as well a **Great Black-back Gull**.

# **Canada Water**

Very little change in bird life here, until 10<sup>th</sup> when 2 **Shelduck** visited briefly. This is a very scarce duck this far upriver and we only have one other record. I saw a pair near Deptford Creek a couple of months ago and this may well be those birds.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

8 **Egyptian Goose**, and 12 **Tufted duck** were seen on 11<sup>th</sup>, a **Blackcap** was singing near Norway Dock. On 21<sup>st</sup> the **Mute Swan** pair hatched 8 young. The Great Crested Grebe have been elusive this month and no records of breeding so far.

# **Bermondsey**

On 3<sup>rd</sup> a pair of **Egyptian Goose** flew over toward Southwark Park, a **Collared Dove** was singing near Rouel Road Estate and a **Jay** was also seen there.

# April 2024

## **Southwark Park**

The month did not start well, on our first visit we found two dead 1<sup>st</sup> year **Mute Swan**, a third bird was taken into care by **London Wildlife Protection** but died soon after. The remaining bird was in good health and left a few days later. Adding further misfortune on 16<sup>th</sup> I was sent a photo of a dead male **Sparrowhawk** found near the park. **Sparrowhawk** and **Goldcrest** were seen on 9<sup>th</sup>. A pair of **Stock Dove** were in the Ada Salter Garden through the month and on 27<sup>th</sup> we found 6 near the bandstand. On 20<sup>th</sup> we found 4 singing **Blackcap**. **Chiffchaff**, however, seem to be down in number this year with only one singing at The Lake. **Great Spotted Woodpecker** was seen several times and on 8<sup>th</sup> we had our only sighting of **Peregrine** as well as **Coal Tit**.

# King's Stairs & River

On 24<sup>th</sup> we found **Goldcrest**, a male **Blackcap** and a **Chiffchaff**.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

The **Canada Goose** abandoned their nest due to dogs in the pond. 2 **Tufted Duck** were present on 10<sup>th</sup> and on 28<sup>th</sup> there were 8. Two **Willow Warbler** were around Stave Hill Ecology Park on 6<sup>th</sup> and one remained until 11<sup>th</sup>. 8 **Blackcap** (2 on 21<sup>st</sup>) and 4 **Chiffchaff** (2 on 28<sup>th</sup>) were also found on 11<sup>th</sup>. Also one **Greenfinch**. On 28<sup>th</sup> we met up with members of **The London Bird Club** for our spring walk, it had rained most of the night and it was not looking good for the rest of the day. However, the rain held off and we recorded 26 species: **Collared Dove** was calling near Mahogany Pond, **Great Spotted Woodpecker**, **Long-tailed Tit**, 2 pairs of **Blackcap** in Russia Dock Woodland and another male singing at Stave Hill. We found 2 **Stock Dove**, which when combined with the 6 at Southwark Park indicates that we have a reasonable population of these elusive pigeons in Rotherhithe. We had a curious encounter with a **Jay** dismantling a snail by rubbing it against a branch to remove the shell. A report from the 8<sup>th</sup> was of a noisy mobbing by crows at Stave Hill Ecology Park. From previous experiences this was very likely an owl, probably a Short-eared (based on time of year), however we now also have the possibility of the escaped Great Horned Owl to consider.

## **Surrey Water**

A Great Crested Grebe turned up on 6<sup>th</sup> and remained until 11<sup>th</sup>. 22 Tufted Duck and 2 Lesser Black-backed Gull were present on 21<sup>st</sup>.

#### **Canada Water**

Things seem to be developing at this site, by mid-month water levels had dropped and finally it appears reeds and trees are being planted in the drained areas. As always species were low and comprised of the usual suspects; **Mute Swan**, **Coot**, **Lesser Black-Backed Gull** and up to 14 **Tufted Duck**. Perhaps next spring Reed Warbler and Whitethroat will return.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

2 Great Crested Grebe, 20+ Tufted Duck, 3 Lesser Black-backed Gull, Pied Wagtail and Great Spotted Woodpecker were seen on 17<sup>th</sup>.

## March 2024

#### **Southwark Park**

On 4<sup>th</sup> a **Jay** was seen near The Lake, a **Blackcap**, sang briefly, our first this year, and was seen on 6<sup>th</sup> at the back of Ada Salter Garden. One **Egyptian Goose** has been seen over the last couple of weeks and we are wondering if a female is on eggs somewhere. On 5<sup>th</sup> a 1<sup>st</sup> winter **Common Gull** was on the playing field opposite the café, all our recent records have been of adults. 50+ **Starling** remained on the running track green. 8 **Tufted Duck** and up to 30 **Blackheaded Gull** were present until the 11<sup>th</sup> when all but 2 left. Also on 11<sup>th</sup> a **Chiffchaff** was singing near the bandstand. Other highlights were **Great Spotted Woodpecker** and **Peregrine**.

## Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

Pair of **Canada Goose** on Globe Pond, 2 **Jay**, 2 **Goldcrest** and one **Chiffchaff** were the highlights for the month. There are at least two colonies of **House Sparrow**, one at Russia Dock Woodland and another near Globe Pond, we estimated 25+. There is also a small number around The Shed. On 11<sup>th</sup> **Kingfisher** was at Globe Pond, it has been very elusive this winter with only a few sightings reported over the last three months. Also **Grey Wagtail**.

# **Surrey Water**

Still good numbers of **Tufted Duck**, 50 were seen on 7<sup>th</sup>, along with pair **Mute Swan**, pair **Egyptian Goose** and 18 **Black-headed Gull**. On Deal Porters Walk we found 3 **Collared Dove**, until this date we had only seen or heard one.

## **Canada Water**

Usual stuff for the most part with a high count of 100+ Black-headed Gull on 7<sup>th</sup>, also 2 Cormorant, 4 Tufted Duck and a Pied Wagtail.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

A pair of **Great Crested Grebe** still, they were seen displaying on 27<sup>th</sup>. On the 7<sup>th</sup> we also found 2 **Egyptian Goose**, 2 **Mute Swan**, 50+ **Black-headed Gull**, 1 **Common Gull** and 7 **Cormorant**, most displaying white flank and head for the breeding season.

## **Bermondsey**

On 3<sup>rd</sup> two **Siskin** flew south over Bermondsey Station. On 13<sup>th</sup> 15 **Herring Gull** were taking advantage of someone feeding birds on the Rouel Estate green, an exceptional record as we

rarely see more than 6, with them were 2 **Lesser Black-backed Gull**. A **Great Spotted Woodpecker** was seen along Southwark Park Road.

# February 2024

#### **Southwark Park**

**Black-headed Gull** numbers remained at 40+ throughout the month while duck numbers were dominated by **Tufted Duck** with a maximum of 14 on 27<sup>th</sup>, **Shoveler**, a cold weather visitor for us, has been scarce all winter with 3 on 3<sup>rd</sup> and one on 27<sup>th</sup>. 2 **Little Grebe** were seen most days. One **Peregrine** was seen on 10<sup>th</sup>, One **Jay** and a **Chiffchaff** were near The Lake on 14<sup>th</sup>. **Goldcrest** have been elusive this month, being mostly silent, we found one on 14<sup>th</sup>. 60+ **Starling** remained on the sports ground throughout. 3 **Redwing** were in the Bandstand area on 10<sup>th</sup>, also 2 **Mistle Thrush** on 3<sup>rd</sup>. 20+ **House Sparrow** were found near the sports centre. On 29<sup>th</sup> a **Firecrest** was found in Ada Salter Gardens, crests have been quiet and very elusive over the winter and this Firecrest has no doubt been here for several months.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

On 12<sup>th</sup> a pair of **Tufted Duck** and returning pair of **Canada Goose** were on Globe Pond. Only one **Redwing** was in the area on the same day but a couple of excellent finds made up for this; 2 **Siskin** at Bea Pond and one **Lesser Redpoll** in Central Meadow showed very well. The Siskin remained for at least 2 days; this species is usually an autumn/winter fly through for us. We also found one **Greenfinch**. On 23<sup>rd</sup> 6 **Chaffinch** were found at Bea Pond, although regular winter visitor this was our highest count since last autumn. 2 **Goldcrest** were seen on several days.

## **Surrey Water**

72 **Tufted Duck** were on the dock on 12<sup>th</sup>, along with 1 **Egyptian Goose**, 14 **Black-headed Gull** and 2 **Lesser Black-backed Gull**. A **Collared Dove** was calling nearby.

## **Greenland Dock**

On 28<sup>th</sup> there were good gull numbers on the dock with 100+ Black-headed Gull, 2 Herring Gull, 3 Lesser Black-backed Gull and 1 Common Gull. 30+ Tufted Duck, 4 Mute Swan, 2 Egyptian Goose and 2 Great Crested Grebe. A Great Spotted Woodpecker was calling nearby, a scarce species away from nearby Russia Dock Woodland.

# **Canada Water**

A **Sparrowhawk** was soaring over the shopping centre on 23<sup>rd</sup>.

# Bermondsey

Only notable species were **Grey Heron** and **Grey Wagtail** over on 21st.

# January 2024

# **Southwark Park**

While **Canada Goose** numbers went up to 14 by the end of the month we have had no visits from Graylag this winter. The mild winter and the short cold spell failed to bring duck good numbers: only 4 **Shoveler** (a single on 15<sup>th</sup> were our only records) and 2 **Gadwall** on 31<sup>st</sup>.

**Tufted Duck** numbers went from 5 for most of the month to 14 on 31<sup>st</sup>. 2 **Little Grebe** remained throughout and **Black-headed Gull** numbers remained around 40. 2 **Grey Heron** were daily visitors. The 18<sup>th</sup> was a productive day which gave us 6 **Redwing**, 1 **Mistle Thrush** and 1 **Starling**. 2 **Stock Dove** were at the north side on 18<sup>th</sup>, they have been hard to find this winter. **Peregrine** continues to be an irregular visitor. **Sparrowhawk** was reported a couple of times, on 18<sup>th</sup> a female dashed close by at the Warden's Lodge having just completed an ambush on what appeared to be a **Wren** – our only one that day.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

On 2<sup>nd</sup> I received a short video from TVC of a female **Mallard** with 6 young! Usually early brood reports are of Egyptian Goose. 2 **Song Thrush** remained throughout, as did at least 2 **Redwing** (7 on 20<sup>th</sup>). On 5<sup>th</sup> a **Blackcap** was found at Downtown Pond, a flock of around 15 **Long-tailed Tit** with 2 **Goldcrest** were seen and **Grey Wagtail** was also found. On 7<sup>th</sup> a **Kingfisher** was found at Downtown Pond, our latest arrival date so far. **Great Spotted Woodpecker** was seen/heard throughout the month. 1 **Coal Tit** was found on 17<sup>th</sup>, 3 **Chaffinch** were reported at Bea Pond with 1 remaining on 20<sup>th</sup>. On 24<sup>th</sup> we found 3 **Greenfinch** near Stave Hill Pond and a **Chiffchaff** was calling near the Shed. 2 **Jay, Grey Heron** and around 10 **House Sparrow** were also seen during the month.

# **Surrey Water**

110 **Tufted Duck** on 20<sup>th</sup> topped our count; most days around 40 were found. 2 **Lesser Blackbacked Gull**, 2 **Common Gull** with 40+ **Black-headed Gull** on 24<sup>th</sup>. **Common Gull**, despite its name, is a scarce species away from the river these days. 6 **Canada Goose** were around on 20<sup>th</sup> but only 1 **Egyptian Goose** for some time. Also in the area was a small group **Long-tailed Tit** and 1 **Goldcrest** moved through on 24<sup>th</sup>. A **Collared Dove** was calling in Deal Porters Walk on 8<sup>th</sup>.

## **Greenland Dock**

On 8<sup>th</sup> we had a report from London Wildlife Protection that a **Great Crested Grebe** had been picked up dead. 2 were seen together on 13<sup>th</sup> so this may be the first-year bird or a visitor, regardless it is a great loss to our tiny Great Crested Grebe population. On 24<sup>th</sup> we found 50+ **Tufted Duck**, 60+ **Black-headed Gull**, 10+ **Herring Gull**, **7 Lesser Black-backed Gull** and 2 **Common Gull**. 6 **Cormorant** and a **Grey Heron** were also found.

## **Canada Water**

26 **Tufted Duck** and 100+ **Black-headed Gull** with 1 **Common Gull** were seen on 18<sup>th</sup>. A pair of **Egyptian Goose** have been around for a few weeks.

# Bermondsey

The leucistic male **Blackbird** was sighted during the month, although we did not see him last year, he must be at 5 years old. Only other notable was a **Sparrowhawk** on 28<sup>th</sup>.

# 2023

## **Southwark Park**

Waterfowl numbers were low for the time of the year, highlights on The Lake: 4 **Gadwall** on 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2 **Shoveler** on 13<sup>th</sup> and up to 6 **Tufted Duck** throughout the month. Also on 2<sup>nd</sup> 3 **Greylag Goose** was our highest record for some time. Only 10 **Canada Goose** on 26<sup>th</sup> and 2 **Egyptian Goose** for most of the month. **Black-headed Gull** numbers also remained low for the time of the year with around 40 most of the month. On 10<sup>th</sup> 2 **Redwing** were reported moving through the park. On 13<sup>th</sup> a **Jay** was found and a flock of 13+ **Long-tailed Tit** was in Ada Salter Garden. On 19<sup>th</sup> 7 **Starling** went over. Another local scarcity was a **Stock Dove** on 24<sup>th</sup>, we have not seen or heard this species for several weeks. A **Sparrowhawk** was having crow problems on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 2 **Peregrine** were seen on 31<sup>st</sup>.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

Generally a poor month in this area until 15<sup>th</sup> when a noisy **Carrion Crow** mobbing revealed a **Goshawk** over Stave Hill. On 23<sup>rd</sup> a **Sparrowhawk** was seen taking a **Robin**. This our first winter without a returning Kingfisher since 2019, although one was briefly seen that year at Globe Pond.

# **Surrey Water**

70+ **Tufted Duck**, 30+ **Black-headed Gull**, 2 **Mute Swan**, 2 **Egyptian Goose** along with the usual suspects on 16<sup>th</sup>, a **Collared Dove** calling nearby was new for this area.

#### **Canada Water**

On 7<sup>th</sup> 20 **Tufted Duck** were seen, numbers rose to 40 on 9<sup>th</sup>. 40+ **Black-headed Gull** were seen throughout.

## **Bermondsey**

On the morning of 1<sup>st</sup> a body feather of a large owl was found near St. James' Road, Bermondsey, it is in excellent condition and may indicate that the Great Horned Owl is still at large. The only notable sightings were 2 **Redwing** over at night, one on 18<sup>th</sup> and another on 25<sup>th</sup>. A **Jay** was seen around on several days.

## November 2023

## **Southwark Park**

The Lake had 22 **Canada Goose** on 11<sup>th</sup> and 4 **Egyptian Goose**. 40+ **Black-headed Gull** were on The Lake on 21<sup>st</sup>. We had news that the female **Mute Swan** had died after colliding with railings on 19<sup>th</sup> leaving 4 young. By the end of the month 2 **Tufted Duck** remained and 2 **Little Grebe** were seen most days. Also on 11<sup>th</sup> 3 **Goldcrest** were around Ada Salter Garden, one **Mistle Thrush** was at The Bandstand. 2 **Peregrine**, also on 11<sup>th</sup>, was our only sighting this month and a flock of 8 **Magpie** was seen on 21<sup>st</sup>. It has been a poor month all round.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

An early morning watch from Stave Hill on 10<sup>th</sup> turned up 5 **Mute Swan** heading north, 18 **Woodpigeon** and 8 **Chaffinch**. It has been strange migration to say the least with no further

records of Redwing, no Fieldfare through this season and so far no annual Kingfisher. One **Firecrest**, 2 **Goldcrest**, was still on site on 10<sup>th</sup> but it remained elusive and was not relocated. On 21<sup>st</sup> 3 **Jay** and a flock of 15 **Goldfinch** were in the area. On 25<sup>th</sup> two **Mistle Thrush** went over. Other notable sightings include two **Grey Heron** seen for most of the month at Globe Pond, **Sparrowhawk** and at least one **Chiffchaff** was heard. One **Jay** was seen on 25<sup>th</sup>. On 30<sup>th</sup> we had reports of a mixed flock in Russia Dock Woodland that included **Goldcrest**, **Great Tit**, **Blue Tit**, **Long-tailed Tit** and c5 **Coal Tit**. Coal Tit is a scarce species in the area with only two resident pairs (including one pair at Southwark Park) that I am aware of. Our highest winter count was of 8 on 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2021 in Russia Dock Woodland; they passed through within a couple of days.

# **Surrey Water**

We had reports of c30 Tufted Duck, 2 Egyptian Goose and Mute Swan

## **Canada Water**

Very little change: 10 Tufted Duck and 30+ Black-headed Gull were seen on 11th.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

On 6<sup>th</sup> 13 **Greylag** were at Greenland a 2 **Egyptian Goose** were at Norway Dock. On 25<sup>th</sup> we found 20+ **Tufted Duck**, 40+ **Black-headed Gull**, 4 **Lesser Black-backed Gull**, 6 **Cormorant**, 2 **Great Crested Grebe**.

## October 2023

## **Southwark Park**

The Lake had 23 **Canada Goose** on 19<sup>th</sup>, all but three **Egyptian Goose** left. 10 **Gadwall** remained for most of the month but the adverse weather did not bring in anything unusual. One **Collared Dove** went over on 16<sup>th</sup>. On 30<sup>th</sup> we found three **Little Grebe**, an adult and two first year birds. One **Chiffchaff** was near The Lake on 9<sup>th</sup>. On 19<sup>th</sup> a **Coal Tit** was singing near the Gallery. 4 **Mistle Thrush** moved through the park around the Bandstand on 16<sup>th</sup> and seem to be the only autumn visitors this month. 4 **Goldcrest** were around Ada Salter Garden on 24<sup>th</sup>. Other notable species were **Grey Wagtail** on 9th, **Peregrine** and 2 **Grey Heron** were seen most days.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland, and Globe Pond

At the start of the month a **Coal Tit** was around The Shed. On 15<sup>th</sup> a **Sparrowhawk** over Globe Pond and a **Common Buzzard** flew over Albion Bridge. Morning vismig sessions from Stave Hill: 4 **Greenfinch** (11<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup>), 7 **Chaffinch** (14<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>), 10 **Goldfinch** (23<sup>rd</sup>), 7 **Siskin** (11th, 15<sup>th</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup>) and a flock of 24+ **Lesser Redpoll** (25<sup>th</sup>), 4 **Meadow Pipit** were found during the month 1 on 11<sup>th</sup>, 2 on 14<sup>th</sup> over Stave Hill and another dropped into The Long Meadow on 18<sup>th</sup>. Thrushes have been few this autumn 2 **Song Thrush** through on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 14 **Redwing** on 28<sup>th</sup> (possibly the Bermondsey birds from previous day) On 26<sup>th</sup> a **Firecrest** was found in Central Meadow, our first for the winter. There were at least 4 **Goldcrest** in a mixed flock on 25<sup>th</sup>. **Woodpigeon** numbers have also been low this month with 89 on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 34 on 28<sup>th</sup> all heading SW. Other notables were 2 **Greylag** over on 25<sup>th</sup>, **Grey Wagtail** at Globe Pond on 26<sup>th</sup> and 2 **Chiffchaff** on 28<sup>th</sup>.

# **Surrey Water**

On 25<sup>th</sup> 35 **Tufted Duck** and 50+ **Black-headed Gull** amongst the usual suspects. Our most notable find was 6 **Mistle Thrush** on the gasworks on 11<sup>th.</sup> On 31<sup>st</sup> a **Jay** and 6 **Magpie** mobbed a passing Fox. 2 **Egyptian Goose** were around most of the month.

## **Canada Water**

On 24<sup>th</sup> when we found a **Grey Wagtail** and a **Wren**, notable because, other than **Carrion Crow**, this area is mostly passerine free.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

On 15<sup>th</sup> we found 30+ **Tufted Duck**, 40+ **Black-headed Gull**, 2 **Lesser Black-backed Gull**, 10 **Cormorant**, 2 **Great Crested Grebe** and one **Chiffchaff**.

# **Bermondsey**

On 14<sup>th</sup> a **Great Spotted Woodpecker** was in the Rouel Orchard, one was also heard in Monnow Road. Used to be a regular species in this area but then disappeared so these are promising records. On 27<sup>th</sup> 16 **Redwing** flew over Stork's Road toward Canada Water, our first of the season, possibly the same group seen the following day at Stave Hill. At least one **Chiffchaff** remained on Rouel Estate until middle of month. A pair of **Jay** were foraging in streets near Bermondsey Station for at least 2 days from 27th. 2 **Peregrine** went over toward Tower Bridge Road on 30<sup>th</sup>.

## September 2023

# **Southwark Park**

Canada Goose numbers varied during the month with 16 by 25<sup>th</sup>. The Greylag remained throughout. On 2<sup>nd</sup> we counted 25 Egyptian Goose with 27 by 25<sup>th</sup>. We have never seen a flock this size away from Burgess Park. On 2<sup>nd</sup> our first returning Shoveler arrived and remained until 12<sup>th</sup>. There were 12 Gadwall at the end of the month along with 18 Tufted Duck. 2 Collared Dove went over on 25<sup>th</sup>. 3 Little Grebe still present. Gull numbers still low with only 3 Black-headed Gull, 1 Herring Gull and resident pair of Lesser Black-backed Gull. On 29<sup>th</sup> a flock of c50 Starling were feeding at the Sports Ground, a good autumn gathering of adults and immatures. 1 Chiffchaff and at least 2 Blackcap were near Ader Salter Garden on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. A party of 10 Long-tailed Tit were around The Lake. 8 House Martin were over on 12<sup>th</sup>. 4 Goldcrest were active around Ada Salter Garden on 25<sup>th</sup>. Other notable species were Grey Wagtail, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Peregrine and 2 Grey Heron.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The only **Canada Goose** record this month was 3 over on 30<sup>th</sup> along with 4 **Tufted Duck** heading for Surrey Water. On 16<sup>th</sup> we found 5 **Chiffchaff** including one with a **Long-tailed Tit** flock. 5 **House Martin** over The Ecology Park on 27<sup>th</sup>, we also had our first **Meadow Pipit**. A **Coal Tit** found in a tit flock on 13<sup>th</sup>. On 27<sup>th</sup> a flock of 10 **Greenfinch** went through, an excellent record for us as we have not seen evidence of breeding this year. Another local rarity was a female **Kestrel** heading towards Deptford. 11 **Starling** headed to the gasworks at Surrey Water. On 30<sup>th</sup>, after a slow start, 2 **Little Egret** flew over heading toward Greenland Dock.

Our first migrant **Chaffinch** was also seen, this finch does not seem to have bred in the area. While thousands of **Meadow Pipit** were being reported heading down the east coast we got very excited when 6 went over including one that land on Stave Hill!

# **Surrey Water**

We checked this on 9<sup>th</sup> and found 32 **Tufted Duck** along with 2 **Egyptian Goose, Grey Heron** and 20 **Black-headed Gull.** 1 **Chiffchaf**f was calling along The Albion Channel.

#### **Canada Water**

14 **Tufted Duck** and 20 **Black-headed Gull** were counted while **Carrion Crow** was again the only passerine. A **Grey Heron** was seen on 29<sup>th</sup>.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

On 20<sup>th</sup> we saw the **Great Crested Grebe** pair with three large young. 26 **Tufted Duck, 7 Mute Swan** and 2 **Egyptian Goose** were found. On 20<sup>th</sup> we had 40+ **Black-headed Gull** and 3 **Lesser Black-backed Gull** 

# Bermondsey

2 **Chiffchaff** were at Rouel State on 26<sup>th</sup>, with one singing. 6 **House Martin** were over on 8<sup>th</sup> and a pair of **Collared Dove** is still in the area. Other notable species were a pair of **Canada Goose** over on 8<sup>th</sup> and a **Grey Wagtail** on 26<sup>th</sup>.

# August 2023

## **Southwark Park**

A noticeable change in waterfowl numbers by the end of the month; an influx of **Canada Goose** gave us 29 along with 1 **Greylag.** We also had a record number (8) of **Egyptian Goose**; the resident pair were joined by another 6 on 26th. Our first returning **Gadwall** arrived on 1<sup>st</sup> and by 28<sup>th</sup> 6 were on The Lake. The female **Tufted Duck** had 3 young remaining by the end of the month. The **Little Grebe** have 2 well grown young. On 2<sup>nd</sup> 5 **Swift** went through heading south-east (last record for us). **Peregrine** and **Sparrowhawk** were seen on several days throughout the month. Other notables were 4 **House Martin** on 19<sup>th</sup>, a **Coal Tit** on 26<sup>th</sup>, 2 **Starling** and a **Chiffchaff** on 28<sup>th</sup>.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The **Canada Goose** family left at the end of the month to be replaced by a trio, including a ringed adult, from Southwark Park. 3 young **Tufted Duck** were also still on Globe Pond. A female **Sparrowhawk** with a juvenile were regularly seen over Stave Hill. 3 **Chiffchaff** and 1 **Blackcap** were found by the end of the month as well as 2 **Coal Tit** moving through Globe Pond area with a tit flock. **House Martin** numbers varied throughout the month with high of 15+ over The Shed on 9<sup>th</sup> and only 8 at the end of the month. An adult **Grey Heron** was present at Globe Pond most days. A survey of the ponds resulted in 22 **Moorhen** throughout the area including a successful rearing of a single young on Stave Hill Pond. Gull numbers remained low with 9 **Black-headed Gull** through on 10<sup>th</sup>. A single **Starling** on 23<sup>rd</sup> was our only record.

# **Surrey Water**

On 4<sup>th</sup> a new species for Rotherhithe came and went all too briefly – 2 **Glossy Ibis** were seen heading toward Canary Wharf (the observer has extensive experience with Glossy Ibis). 18 **Tufted Duck** were present on 10<sup>th</sup> along with 2 **Egyptian Goose** and 26 **Black-headed Gull.** 

#### **Canada Water**

Very little of note other than 12 Black-headed Gull on 8th along with 9 Tufted Duck.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

On 8<sup>th</sup> a pair **Great Crested Grebe** were seen with 3 young. Sparrowhawk was seen several times during the month.

# **July 2023**

# **Southwark Park**

On 10<sup>th</sup> a single **Black-headed Gull** marked our first return. On 14<sup>th</sup> 8 **Herring Gull** went over and 2 **Little Egret** dropped in, our 2<sup>nd</sup> record in the park. On 3rd a flock of 10+ **House Martin** were feeding low over The Lake along with 2 **Sand Martin**. **Coal Tit** was heard on 7<sup>th</sup> and on 18<sup>th</sup> a **Mistle Thrush** was near The Bandstand and an immature **Starling** was near the café. During the month we also had several of sightings of 2 **Peregrine** and **Sparrowhawk**.

# King's Stairs & River

With gull numbers slowly rising as they return from the breeding sites we found 10+ Black-headed Gull, 10+ Lesser Black-backed Gull and a single Great Black-backed Gull on 31<sup>st</sup>. 5 House Martin were over the river on 18<sup>th</sup>.

## Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The family of **Canada Goose** continues at Globe Pond, all 7 young are now full sized. The single surviving young **Tufted Duck** is about half grown, and female with 3 young turned up on 26<sup>th</sup>. 3 **Swift** were over The Shed on 26<sup>th</sup>. The resident **Song Thrush** was joined by another on 19<sup>th</sup> with both birds singing on either side of The Shed compound. **Jay** have bred and fledged one, all three birds were in Russia Dock Woodland on 5<sup>th</sup>. 2 **Chiffchaff** were singing mid-month along with 3 **Blackcap**. Plenty of fledged **Blue** and **Great Tit** along with a party of **Long-tailed Tit** around the Long Meadow. A good presence of hirundines with 4 **Sand Martin** on 6<sup>th</sup> and 10 **House Martin** over 26<sup>th</sup>. An adult **Grey Heron** was present at Globe Pond most days and a **Grey Wagtail** also turned up.

# **Surrey Water**

The **Reed Warbler** in Albion Channel remained and sang through most of the month.

# **Greenland Dock, Norway Dock & South Dock**

On 3<sup>rd</sup> a **Common Tern** made a brief appearance before returning to the river, our first record for some time. On 14<sup>th</sup> a **Tufted Duck** brood of 3 was reported. 3 **Great Crested Grebe**.

# Bermondsey

Two notable sightings this month; a **Jackdaw** went over on 13<sup>th</sup>, a very scarce species in the area with only one or two records a year. On 25<sup>th</sup> a **Peregrine** was being mobbed by a **Carrion Crow** over Rouel Estate. 5 **House Martin** were also seen over on 25<sup>th</sup>. 3 **Cormorant** heading North went over on 4<sup>th</sup>.

#### June 2023

# **Southwark Park**

25 **Starling** over the Bandstand area and at least 10 **House Sparrow** near the Sports Centre on 12<sup>th.</sup> On 13<sup>th</sup> we had **Coal Tit** calling near Ada Salter Gardens. Things picked up with a **Sand Martin** on 26<sup>th</sup> and around 15 **House Martin** on 28<sup>th</sup>. On 20<sup>th</sup> one **Swift** was over The Lake. **Little Grebe** had one young on 12th. We counted 22 **Canada Goose** including 8 young but we also logged two dead adults. **Mute Swan** continued with 4 young but the **Egyptian Goose** young were gone by the end of the month. One **Stock Dove** was calling on several days and **Peregrine** was over the park on 13<sup>th</sup>.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The family of **Canada Goose** continues at Globe Pond. By 21<sup>st</sup> all but one **Tufted Duck** had left, this last, a female had a brood of 13 which was doomed from the start; even as we watched, a dog off its lead killed one chick in the pond and a week later we only found one chick and no adult. At least 3 **Chiffchaff** and 6 **Blackcap** continued to sing through the month. **Cetti's Warbler** was last heard on 8<sup>th</sup>. On 7<sup>th</sup> we had 20+ **Swift** over the Long Meadow, with at least 15 seen the following day. This is a remarkable number of Swift through the area since 2 or 3 is more likely these days. This late move also brought through one **Swallow**. On 8<sup>th</sup> a **Common Buzzard** went over North and a **Sand Martin** was over Stave Hill. On 10<sup>th</sup> 3 **Starling** including one juvenile went over The Shed. The **Song Thrush** continues to sing but has moved from the Long Meadow to Stave Hill Pond area. A **Mistle Thrush** was seen on 10<sup>th</sup>.

# **Surrey Water**

On 10<sup>th</sup> 2 **Sedge Warbler** singing in nearby Albion Channel, as it turned out there was also a **Reed Warbler** with them. The Sedge were soon gone but **Reed Warbler** remained to be joined by a 2<sup>nd</sup> a few days later, both remained throughout the month. On 19<sup>th</sup> one **Great Crested Grebe** was present along with 13 **Tufted Duck**. We found at 20 **House Martin** at the colony near Salt Quay, nearby two pairs of **Sand Martin** were feeding young. On 30<sup>th</sup> there were c12 feeding over Albion Channel.

## **Canada Water**

Last month I wrote: **Mute Swan** nest was abandoned and no sign of swans. To misquote a misquote, the disappearance of the Canada Water swans has been greatly exaggerated since on 12th we saw both birds with 3 young, where they were hiding last month is anyone's guess! There were originally 4 young and by the end of the month only 2 remained. On 17<sup>th</sup> we got a message that there were 2 **Great Crested Grebe** on the water and they were already under attack by the Mute Swan. This is the first record of Great Crested Grebe on Canada Water for over 6 years.

#### **Greenland Dock**

On 1<sup>st</sup> we found 13 **Tufted Duck**. 4 **Great Crested Grebe** were seen on 17<sup>th</sup>. **Mute Swan**, **Egyptian Goose** and a pair of **Lesser Black-backed Gull** are regulars here.

# Bermondsey

There are at least 2 pairs of **Collared Dove** in the area. 3 **House Martin** were over on 6<sup>th</sup> and c10 were seen on 24<sup>th</sup>. On morning of 17<sup>th</sup> an **Oystercatcher** went over calling several times, a new patch tick. An out of place female **Mallard** was walking up Grange Road on 21<sup>st</sup>.

# May 2023

## **Southwark Park**

**Blackbird** and **Long-tailed Tit** were seen with fledged young while on The Lake there were two broods of **Canada Goose.** 2 **Little Grebe** but no further sign of breeding. On 23<sup>rd</sup> we found 6 **Stock Dove** feeding on the ground at the North side of the park, they may well be the entire Rotherhithe population. A **Coal Tit** was singing on 5<sup>th</sup> when we also found 13 **Starling** around the Bandstand, all adult and the highest number that we have seen at this time of the year. A **Mistle Thrush** was also around the Bandstand on 29<sup>th</sup> and on the same day a **Chaffinch** was singing at the Sports Ground. Other notable species during the month were **Peregrine**, **Grey Wagtail** and **Collared Dove**.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

On 1<sup>st</sup> reports of a Long-eared Owl found in Russia Dock Woodland turned out to be an escaped **Great Horned Owl**, remained on site for two days before turning up in Bermondsey on 15<sup>th</sup>. It returned to Rotherhithe a few days later. On 2<sup>nd</sup> we heard **Willow Warbler** for the last time and 2 **Swallow** over, also 2 **Mistle Thrush** went through. On 5<sup>th</sup> we saw our first **Swift** over Stave Hill, 2 were seen on 7<sup>th</sup> and again on 10<sup>th</sup>. On 7<sup>th</sup> **The Chorus Day** event with **Sound Camp** gave us 30 species including great sounds and views of the **Cetti's Warbler**. Another **Song Thrush** was singing at Mahogany Pond but was gone soon after. The **Song Thrush** at Long Meadow continued to sing for the rest of the month. We also had 20+ **House Martin** over in the morning. Other notable species were **Stock Dove** and **Grey Heron** on 24<sup>th</sup>.

## **Surrey Water**

8 **Tufted Duck** remained on 22<sup>nd</sup>, also **Grey Heron** and 2 adult **Black-headed Gull** went over. 1 **Blackcap** was singing along the wooded path to Canada Water. On 22<sup>nd</sup> we took a walk along the river to check the **House Martin** colony near Surrey Water and found only 8.

## **Canada Water**

8 **Tufted Duck** on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

## **Greenland Dock**

2 Great Crested Grebe remain.

## **Norway Dock**

Male Pochard on 31st.

# **Bermondsey**

A couple of notable sighting this month; a **Swift** high over on 5<sup>th</sup> and a **Hobby** hunting low over the Community Orchard at Rouel Estate on 10<sup>th</sup>.

# **April 2023**

## **Southwark Park**

A **Common Buzzard** over on 3rd. on 10th a pair of **Pochard** arrived, the first record in the park for over 30 years! Also **Common Sandpiper** and **Grey Wagtail** while a **Firecrest** was relocated for the last time. **Hobby** was seen over the park on 11th and 12th, followed on 22nd by a **Red Kite** and a **Common Whitethroat** near The Lake.

## Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The Canada Goose at Globe Pond are incubating three eggs. On 5th a male Common Pheasant was in the TCV compound. On 8th one Swallow over Stave Hill. On 15th Listening Group for Sound Camp logged 28 species that included 2 Willow Warbler and Chaffinch. Also a Common Buzzard over in the afternoon and a Nuthatch was heard near Archangel Street, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Rotherhithe record since Southwark Park on 15th January 2019. One Willow Warbler was seen on 23rd during the London Bird Club walk. The Song Thrush was still near The Long Meadow. Despite poor weather we managed to log 29 species including an elusive Common Whitethroat. Blackcap numbers changed over the course of a few days with at least 7 singing on 19th and only 3 on 26th. Cetti's Warbler, found by a local photographer and a first for Rotherhithe was present most of the month.

# **Surrey Water**

**Tufted Duck** numbers dropped from 45 on 8th to 24 on 19th, when they were joined by the pair of **Pochard** from Southwark Park. A pair of **Lesser Black-backed Gull** seem to have established themselves but no sign of breeding.

#### **March 2023**

# **Southwark Park**

Black-headed Gull numbers went from 60+ on 2<sup>nd</sup>, 40+ on 11<sup>th</sup> and by 16<sup>th</sup> only 6 immatures remained. Up to 6 Canada Goose and a Greylag x Canada hybrid were seen most of the month. On 27<sup>th</sup> the Egyptian Goose pair had 8 young which were all predated. 12 Tufted Duck throughout most of the month. One Shoveler was on the Lake on 11<sup>th</sup> and a pair of Gadwall dropped in on 2<sup>nd</sup>. A pair of Sparrowhawk were seen throughout the month. A pair of Little Grebe were together by middle of the month. A Grey Heron was seen on 2<sup>nd</sup>. On 4<sup>th</sup> a Peregrine went over. Two Firecrest were still on 18<sup>th</sup>. A Chaffinch sang at Gomm Gate on 4<sup>th</sup> later moving to The Warden's Lodge where a female was also found on 23<sup>rd</sup>. On 4<sup>th</sup> 20 Redwing gathered in the Bandstand area. On 31<sup>st</sup> a singing Willow Warbler was our earliest record in the park. 20 Starling around the Bandstand on 4<sup>th</sup> later moved to the Sports Ground on 10<sup>th</sup>. Also of note was Coal Tit and 2 Mistle Thrush seen several times, 2 Blackcap and 3

**Chiffchaff** were singing by the end on the month. A **Water Rail** seen on 13<sup>th</sup> was another first for the park.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The pair of **Canada Goose** at Globe Pond were still around but no sign of breeding so far. On 21<sup>st</sup> a pair of **Tufted Duck** dropped in. On 5<sup>th</sup> 10 **Redwing** remained, usually 15+ (in the same week of 2019 around 30 gathered prior to migration). On 5<sup>th</sup> a pair of **Stock Dove** were at Globe Pond and another was in Russia Dock Woodland. 10 **Moorhen** were counted around the ponds. **Water Rail** and **Kingfisher** remained at Downtown Pond. **Grey Wagtail** at Globe Pond. Other notable sightings was a party of 6+ **Long-tailed Tit, Sparrowhawk, Song Thrush** singing on 1<sup>st</sup> near the Long Meadow, male **Greenfinch** on 5<sup>th</sup> along with 10 **Goldfinch**. On 31<sup>st</sup> 3 **Chiffchaff** and 2 **Blackcap** were singing around Stave Hill and Russia Dock Woodland.

# **Surrey Water**

On 5<sup>th</sup> 50 **Tufted Duck** and by 31<sup>st</sup> only 15 remained. Also, on 5<sup>th</sup> a **Common Gull** was with 30+ **Black-headed Gull** along with a pair of **Lesser Black-backed Gull**. By 12<sup>th</sup> the resident **Egyptian Goose** had lost their brood – a regular occurrence at this time of the year.

## **Greenland Dock**

A pair of Lesser Black-backed Gulls and one Great Crested Grebe were the only notable species.

# **Canada Water**

**Coot, Moorhen** and **Mute Swan** are using the platforms that have been provided. 15 **Blackheaded Gull** were seen on 20<sup>th</sup> but left soon after. **Tufted Duck** numbers ranged from 9 on 20<sup>th</sup> to 18 on 31<sup>st</sup>.

# Bermondsey

A **Fulmar** was found at Grange Road on 8<sup>th</sup> and rescued by **London Wildlife Protection**. This appears to be the first record in this area since one was at Tower Bridge on 14<sup>th</sup> February 1994 (Birds of London by Andrew Self). A **Collared Dove** was calling at Rouel Road estate on 21<sup>st</sup> and a **Chiffchaff** was singing near Bermondsey Station on 23<sup>rd</sup>.

# February 2023

# **Southwark Park**

On The Lake the **Mute Swan** pair were seen repairing last year's nest under the willow. A pair of **Shoveler** on 13<sup>th</sup> and a pair of **Gadwall** on 18<sup>th</sup>. **Black-headed Gull** numbers rose to c100 on 13<sup>th</sup> but generally c40 were present most days. The **Firecrest** continued to roam from The Ada Salter Garden and Nature Area. A male **Sparrowhawk** on 17<sup>th</sup>. On 13<sup>th</sup> one **Starling** went over. On 18<sup>th</sup> several **House Sparrow** behind The Gallery, also in the area a **Mistle Thrush** singing. On 21<sup>st</sup> 2 **Song Thrush** in the Rose Garden; one remained and sang for 2 days. At King's Stairs a pair of **Goldcrest** on 21<sup>st</sup>. Over-wintering male **Blackcap** was still in The Ada Salter Garden on 25<sup>th</sup> and a **Chaffinch** was singing at Gomm Gate. Also, in the Rose Garden a

pair **Stock Dove** seen several times. A **Redwing** went over on 13<sup>th</sup>. A **Coal Tit** was singing in several locations throughout the month.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

On 4<sup>th</sup> a male Chaffinch, 3 Egyptian Goose and a pair of Canada Goose at Globe, 3 Mute Swan over. On 4<sup>th</sup> a Song Thrush was seen again on 19<sup>th</sup>. A Kingfisher remained at Downtown Pond until 25th. Grey Wagtail on 19<sup>th</sup> and 2 Redwing seen throughout the month.

# **Surrey Water**

Good numbers of Tufted Duck remained with 60+ on 11th. 2 Common Gull on 21st.

#### **Canada Water**

c50 Black-headed Gull were seen on 11<sup>th</sup> along with a high count of 15 Tufted Duck.

## Bermondsey

On 23<sup>rd</sup> a flock of 18 **Magpie** were along St James's Road, a record high away from Southwark Park and Stave Hill/Russia Dock Woodland.

## January 2023

# **Southwark Park**

The year started well with 26 species on 1<sup>st</sup>: The Lake held 40+ **Black-headed Gull**, 3 **Cormorant**, 1 **Tufted Duck** and 3 **Shoveler**. A singing **Coal Tit** was present throughout. The **Mistle Thrush** and 3 **Blackbird** were still feeding together the conifer near the Ada Salter Garden. 2 **Firecrest** remained throughout the month. 5 **Egyptian Goose** turned up on 4<sup>th</sup>, only 2 remained after this date. On 9<sup>th</sup> a pair of **Stock Dove** were back. 2 **Grey Heron** visited on and off during the month. On 10<sup>th</sup> a **Starling** was singing near Jamaica Road and an overwintering male **Blackcap** was found on 16<sup>th</sup>. At least 6 **Redwing** were seen on 27<sup>th</sup>. On 31<sup>st</sup> 2 **Common Gull** were at the Sports Centre, while on the Lake a pair of **Gadwall**, a pair of **Shoveler**. Also, on 31<sup>st</sup> a **Collared Dove** and 3 **Mistle Thrush**.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The **Water Rail** relocated to Downtown Pond and was heard and seen on 6<sup>th</sup> and still present on 31<sup>st</sup>. A **Kingfisher** was also at Downtown Pond. 10 **Black-headed Gull** and a pair of **Egyptian Goose** were on Globe Pond on 6<sup>th</sup>. 2 **Mute Swan** over on 29<sup>th</sup>. A **Collared Dove** went over on 6<sup>th</sup>. 5 **Jay** were seen on 29<sup>th</sup> and one pair of **Great Spotted Woodpecker** throughout January. At least 10 **Redwing** stayed around Globe Pond.

# **Surrey Water**

Around 85 **Tufted Duck** were present on 6<sup>th</sup> and a first for the patch was a female **Shoveler**, possibly the same one at Downtown Pond on 24<sup>th</sup> December. 30+ **Black-headed gull** and a single **Common Gull** were present most of the month. On 15<sup>th</sup> a pair of **Gadwall** arrived, a single **Redwing** was also found.

## **Canada Water**

A visit on 6<sup>th</sup> found 4 **Tufted Duck** and only **Black-headed Gull** along with a **Grey Wagtail**. **Note:** there is currently a considerable amount of construction work on and around Canada Water

Bermondsey: a leucistic male Blackbird returned for 2<sup>nd</sup> Winter Bermondsey.

# 2022

#### December 2022

## **Southwark Park**

Mute Swan have done poorly this year, and the last of this year's young were found dead on the 3rd, with the remaining adult leaving soon after. The cold spell froze most of the Lake, driving away the Little Grebe that we only found on the 8th. Tufted Duck numbers were low, with only one pair sighted over the month, while up to six Shoveler remained throughout. A single Common Gull was on the Lake with Black-headed Gull on the 17th. Black-headed Gull numbers rose to around 75 on the 5th but dropped off to around 40 at the end of the month. A pair of **Teal** turned up on the 12th but did not hang around. Twenty-five **Woodpigeons** were in the Park on the 8th, and by the end of the month we had also found singles of Stock Dove and Collared Dove; these two species have been absent for some time. Chiffchaff and Firecrest remained around the Lake along with at least five Goldcrest. A Mistle Thrush took up residence in the juniper near the Rose Garden, along with at least three Blackbird (a total of six on the 17th); there was a lot of activity around this tree. Although **Redwing** numbers remained very low for most of the month, the 17th bought some 150 through the Park, travelling south. This may have been the large flock from Surrey Water, moving on after stripping out all the berries in that area. Other noteworthy species were a Coal Tit on the 24th, a **Sparrowhawk**, and a **Peregrine** towards the end of the month. Around the Sports Centre, we found a small group of House Sparrow, and two Starling passed through on the 17th.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

December started with a sighting of seven Canada Geese overhead on the 1st and went on to give us a good record of notable species. A female **Shoveler** dropped into Downtown Pond on the 24th (this was our first record since January 2019). **Shoveler** are regular winter visitors to Southwark Park, but rarely turn up anywhere else on the peninsula. The freezing weather that arrived mid-month also bought a Water Rail to Globe Pond. Several people were lucky enough to get a good look, as this elusive bird was forced to run across the ice between reed patches. Two Kingfisher remained throughout, ranging between Globe and Downtown Ponds, occasionally together. On the 13th, 20 Black-headed Gull visited Globe Pond, along with a single Common Gull. Records of this once-regular species are few and far between, this being our first record since 2018. A Grey Heron continued to visit Globe Pond and was joined by another adult on the 27th. A Coal Tit, locally scarce, sighted on the 23rd made for a good winter record, while a **Chiffchaff** also remained in the area until the end of the month. The two Fieldfare remained around the Central Meadow and were seen several times during the month, and at least 40 Redwing remained until the 17th. Three Song Thrush on the 1st was our highest count for some time. Other notables were a Sparrowhawk and four Jay on the 1st.

## **Surrey Water**

Good numbers of **Tufted Duck** stayed throughout the month, but the cold weather failed to bring in any interesting ducks. Notable birds during the month included a single **Common Gull**, possibly the same bird seen at Globe Pond and in Southwark Park, three **Starling** on the gasworks and at least 100 **Redwing** feeding on remaining berries near the Lake before moving on.

## **Canada Water**

Construction work on and around the Lake continues, and there was very little change in bird records for this site. **Tufted Duck** numbers rose to 75 on the 12th, while **Black-headed Gull** numbers rose to around 50.

# **Bermondsey Station area**

A group of three **Mistle Thrush** flew through on the 7th; at least two remained until the 23rd when they were seen with at least five **Redwing** feeding on a few remaining rowan berries.

Excluding the hybrids and exotics, we logged 48 species during December.

## **November 2022**

## **Southwark Park**

On the 4th, our record number of 14 **Gadwall** were still on the Lake, along with the **Yellow-billed Teal**; all left together soon after. The **Mute Swan** has lost another young to probable avian influenza. A trio of **Shoveler** arrived on the 14th, but two females soon left. A single female **Tufted Duck** seen arriving with a **Mallard**, probably from Surrey Water where many **Tufted Duck** gather, was a regular visitor. **Black-headed Gull** numbers at the Lake rose to over 70 on the 21st, but the average was around 30 on most days. The last decent flock of migrating **Woodpigeon** to fly over the Park went through on the morning of the 2nd, with more than 40 heading southwest. Only one **Chiffchaff** was found during the month, occasionally joining a **Long-tailed Tit** flock. At least one **Firecrest** remained in and around the Rose Garden but proved elusive. A **Mistle Thrush** was near the Lake on the 28th. **Redwing** numbers were greatly reduced in the area, with only three on the 21st passing through the Park.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

We continued with a few more early morning-visible migration meets from the top of Stave Hill and had good results — 580 plus **Woodpigeon** in groups of 30 to 50 went through on the 4th; by the 12th there were only 20. Four **Meadow Pipit** also went through on the 4th. Other notables were a **Brambling**, three **Lesser Redpoll** over the month and two **Fieldfare** that stayed in the Goblin Wood area for the rest of the month. This is a good record for us, as **Fieldfare** rarely hang around for long. It seems that the majority of **Redwing** have now gone through, with only 11 appearing during the month. Another interesting record was the **Blackbird** migration; it is a rare thing for me to see **Blackbird** flying high overhead. Another odd occurrence on the 4th was a mass of over 30 **Carrion Crow** mobbing an unseen raptor or owl that had dropped into a tree near Downtown Road. Buzzard and Short-eared Owl trigger a massive mob response from crows, and we watched several head over from the direction

of Southwark Park and Canada Water just to join in. Whatever it was got away soon after, and the noise dwindled into a sort of crow grumble as the ones that had made the effort for nothing headed back over us. Twelve **Canada Geese** flew over on the 18th, but we only saw a single **Egyptian Goose** go over on the 4th. Two **Kingfisher** remained on site. A lot of tracking by Rotherhithe Birders revealed that we have had a change of **Kingfisher**; originally a male and female turned up, but the female left and was replaced by a first-year bird. Three **Stock Dove** heading east on the 18th was our first sighting for some time. At least 24 **Ring-neck Parakeet** commuted through on the 4th. A **Long-tailed Tit** flock of over ten wandered around the area and was joined by **Great Tits** and **Blue Tit**; this is a good time to check through these flocks (we have yet to find a **Firecrest** in this area). At least two **Chiffchaff** remain. Seventeen **Starling** flew over, heading for Surrey Water, on the 12th.

# **Surrey Water**

**Tufted Duck** numbers dropped to over 50, and **Black-headed Gull** numbers were also down to 20 on the 4th. A pair of **Gadwall** were found on the 19th; a good find (possibly a first for Surrey Water) considering that the Southwark Park flock had left some time earlier. Over 30 **Starling** gathered on the old gasworks on the 12th. Sadly, the only **Common Gull** this month, on the 19th, appeared to be suffering from avian influenza. Another gull was seen in a similar state along the river.

#### **Canada Water**

This was a particularly uneventful month for Canada Water, with over 30 **Black-headed Gull** and six **Tufted Duck** as notable sightings.

## **Greenland Dock and the River Thames**

After visible migration on the 12th, we headed to Durand's Wharf and along the river to Greenland Dock. We found four **Common Gull**, four **Lesser Black-backed Gull** and a single **Great Black-backed Gull** amongst 150 plus **Black Headed Gull**. Eighty-six **Tufted Duck** were on Greenland Dock, as well as three **Great Crested Grebe**. We counted 12 **Cormorant**, and many of these were likely the birds that we had seen from Stave Hill earlier in the morning.

Excluding the hybrids and exotics, we logged 51 species during November.

# October 2022

#### **Southwark Park**

On the 4th, we found a **Firecrest** in the Rose Garden; I suspected two were present, and this was later confirmed. This is our first winter record in Rotherhithe of this species. Five **Blackbird** also spotted on the 4th was a good number for the Park. On the 12th, we encountered the **Greylag** and **Canada Goose** pair that had previously bred at Globe Pond. They had with them seven hybrid young, but we have no idea where they were raised. We had a decent passage through on the 13th, with a single **Song Thrush**, four **Chaffinch** and a flock of over ten **Linnet**. **Redwing** started to arrive on around the second week of the month, with over four arriving on the 10th and a high of around 70 on the 20th. Bear in mind that by this time several thousand were passing through other parts of the country. **Chiffchaff** numbers rose throughout the month, with at least six feeding together on Willow Island. They

later joined up with **Long-tailed Tit**, and on the 20th, I found a mixed flock by the Lake that included **Long-tailed Tit**, **Great Tit**, **Blue Tit**, a **Wren**, a **Robin**, two **Chiffchaff** and a **Firecrest**; it has been many years since I have seen such an impressive mixed foraging party. By the end of the month, we had only found one **Chiffchaff**. We had noticed that the number of **Mute Swan** young had dropped to four and believed that they had left, but we were later told that they had been dying. As I've mentioned before, **Gadwall** have become regular visitors to the Park over the last couple of years, and this season has been exceptional with 14 on the Lake by the end of the month. On the 24th, we found an odd, unfamiliar duck with a bright yellow and black bill that seemed to have dropped in with the **Gadwall**. It was an elusive little duck and, eventually, after much stalking and patience by Rotherhithe Birders, it was finally identified as a **Yellow-billed Teal** (not a **Yellow-billed Pintail** as previously thought). In an autumn of incredible rarities elsewhere, this duck native to South America is most definitely an escape and was still on the Lake on the 28th.

## Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

A pair of Egyptian Geese flew over Stave Hill, heading for Surrey Water. On the 9th, we met up for a walk with the London Bird Club. We found 25 species with the highlight being a Kingfisher at Downtown Pond; another sighting on Globe Pond was likely the second bird (this was confirmed at the end of the month). On the 15th, a dawn bird watch from Stave Hill gave us our second Jackdaw record this year and our third record for the Stave Hill area. It perched on the turbine for at least five minutes before flying off with some Carrion Crow. On the 22nd, we had one of our few **Mute Swan** flyovers — a first-year bird that we saw on two days during visible migration. Another visitor was a small, white duck that has been dropping into Globe Pond over the last few weeks. This looks more like a fancy breed and is not one of the local hybrids. Towards the end of the month, **Woodpigeon** numbers rose — over 225 flew over Stave Hill on the morning of the 26th. Also on this date, a female **Kestrel** flew over our group; this is only our second record since 2019. It is hard to believe that we have had more Common Buzzard and Red Kite records in the area than this once common and familiar falcon. Redwing numbers remained low, with a rounded-up figure of more than 90 over Stave Hill for the month. A total of eight Chaffinch were recorded going through, but we were also lucky enough to pick up a **Brambling** on the 26th and a **Siskin** on the 15th.

## **Surrey Water**

**Tufted Duck** numbers rose and fell over the month, with a high of around 130 on the 15th, along with over 50 **Black-headed Gull**. On the 22nd, we a found a **Mistle Thrush** and a flock of over 30 **Redwing**. A pair of **Grey Wagtail** are regular visitors to the area.

#### **Canada Water**

Forty-five **Tufted Duck** on the 28th were likely some of the Surrey Water birds, as numbers dropped there by the end of the month. Over 50 **Black-headed Gull** were on the water at the start of the month.

Excluding the hybrids and exotics, we logged 51 species during October.

# September 2022

#### **Southwark Park**

The excitement of late August continued in to the first week of September with two **Spotted Flycatcher** near the Lake; they remained for at least two days. On the 3rd, a male **Sparrowhawk** following a group of **Goldfinch** was mobbed by a couple of **Carrion Crow**. As the crows left, the **Sparrowhawk** was joined by another bird, a male **Peregrine Falcon**, which it chased off toward Jamaica Road. A single **Mistle Thrush** on the 3rd was spotted. **Mistle Thrush** is, like so many species, in decline. We have had few sightings in the area this year.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

A single **Chaffinch** passed through on the 1st, and a **Coal Tit** was near Mahogany Pond on the 1sth. A **Pied Flycatcher** was found in the Long Meadow on the evening of the 5th. We have certainly had an excellent flycatcher year in Rotherhithe. On the 8th, we found what appeared to be a female **Mandarin Duck** on Globe Pond. I had some doubts about this bird, as an adult female should have a crest. A close look at photos taken of this bird showed that it was a male in eclipse; a couple of days later, a 'female' **Mandarin Duck** was at Brookmill Park. I suspect that this is the same male that arrived last year and that also turned up on Southwark Park lake earlier this year. A **Grey Wagtail** has again become a regular visitor to Globe Pond and Back Pond.

# August 2022

#### **Southwark Park**

It was pointed out that there are in fact two pairs of **Little Grebe** on the Lake and that both had broods — the pair we saw last month with two young and a pair with a single, older chick that evaded our visits for over a week before we saw it. Sadly, the younger brood was lost within two weeks. A pair of **Gadwall** on the 16th was a good summer record for us. This species has been turning up regularly, although infrequently, for at least three years. Six **House Martin** over the Lake was our highest count for some time, and numbers have been low this year. There was quite a lot of excitement towards the end of the month, starting with a good warbler return from around the 20th, with over four **Chiffchaff** and two **Willow Warbler** feeding regularly in trees near one of the viewpoints. We had no spring passage of **Willow Warbler**. 'Bird of the month' for the Park was undoubtedly the **Pied Flycatcher** near the Lake on the 23rd, which remained until at least the 26th. There has been a good movement through London of **Pied Flycatcher**, as there was a few years back when at least two were at Stave Hill and Russia Dock Woodland, and one was at the Park, calling near the Bandstand. A **Sparrowhawk** turned up on the 23rd, chased by a **Carrion Crow** across the Park.

The Bat Watch on Wednesday the 17th of August had a good turn out, and we managed to track down **Soprano** and **Common Pipistrelle**. A probable **Brown Long-eared Bat** was again around the bowling green area.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

An unremarkable July turned into an exciting August, with a string of good records starting on the 4th with a **Hobby** and a **Common Buzzard** over The Shed. The 14th turned out to be one of those drop-in days, with the sighting of a **Reed Warbler** on Downtown Pond, a returning **Willow Warbler** and two **Sedge Warbler**, which remained for at least three days on Stave Hill

Pond. On the 27th, two **Reed Warbler** and another **Sedge Warbler**, our fourth this year, were found at Downtown Pond. A **Grey Wagtail** and our first **Spotted Flycatcher** this year were also found on the 27th. Also of note were three immature **Grey Heron**, which turned up on Globe Pond on the 14th. This is the first time that we have had more than one immature bird.

# **July 2022**

# **Southwark Park**

Mid-summer birding in parks has quite a few challenges: there is little change in species and singing has all but faded away. At least two **Blackcap** are still around the Lake; now you need to listen for what sounds like two pebbles knocked together indicating that somewhere in that bush is a skulking bird. The pair of **Egyptian Geese** have also bred, with a single youngster seen at the start of the month. This pair seemed rather laid back about things; the last time **Egyptian Geese** bred in the Park, a few years ago, they were chasing everything off. On the 25th, I found the first returning **Black-headed Gull** with three adults around the Lake. Also on the 25th, was the **Little Grebe** pair with two newly hatched young. On the 4th, a pair of **Grey Wagtail** visited the Lake — the first sighting of this species for some time. A single **Swift** on the 4th was the only record this month; by mid-August, **Swift** will be leaving for Africa. I was lucky enough to see all four **Peregrine**, and judging from the bulging crop of one juvenile, it had recently fed. A single **Chiffchaff** called briefly in the Nature Area on the 2nd.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

Apart from the heat, it has been an unremarkable month. **Blackcap** and **Chiffchaff** have stopped singing, while a single **Greenfinch** near The Shed was a good find. The **Grey Heron** remained at Globe Pond, and a single **Grey Wagtail** was the first record for quite a while. We counted at least ten **Moorhen** between Globe Pond and Downtown Pond. Bea Pond was dried out, and work was being done clearing silt.

## June 2022

# **Southwark Park**

The Mute Swan family is doing well, and all six young have survived. While a pair of Tufted Duck have remained throughout the season, there is still no evidence of breeding. On the 6th, there was a lot of Ringed-neck Parakeet activity, with several recently fledged young around the islands. We saw Blackbird chasing these shorted-tailed fledglings several times; perhaps the shape reminds them of a predator, such as a peregrine passing through. Up to five House Martin have been visiting the Lake, but we only saw one Swift fly over on the 27th. 'Bird of the month' was the male Reed Warbler that dropped into the little reedbed in front of the Rose Garden; he sang for at least two days before moving on. So far this is the only record of this species in Rotherhithe this year. At least four Blackcap were still singing at the end of the month, and a single Collared Dove still has a territory near the old café, but there has been no sign of breeding. Stock Dove have also been rather elusive lately, with only a couple of sightings during the month.

It was bought to our attention that **Peregrine** have bred somewhere in Rotherhithe and fledged two young. We have contacted The London Peregrine Partnership who monitor peregrines throughout the London area, and we have been informed that the birds we see in our area may be from further afield.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

By the end of the month, the long-staying pair of **Canada Geese** had left Globe Pond; the abandoned nest contained two eggs. A pair of **Tufted Duck** that arrived in May had a brood of five young on the 22nd. **Blackcap** and **Chiffchaff** have continued to sing throughout, and the **Song Thrush** was again singing at his territory near the Long Meadow.

# May 2022

# **Southwark Park**

Coot, Moorhen, Mallard and Canada Geese. The Mute Swan are also finally succeeding in hatching six young. The Little Grebe have been very active, and we were lucky enough to find that the youngster from last year is still hanging around. Two Sand Martin over the bandstand on the afternoon of the 10th were a welcome sight — this species has all but disappeared from the area over the last few years. We also found a pair of Coal Tit on the 28th, and judging by the amount of wear on the heads, they were feeding young — a great find as we have not heard Coal Tit in the Park for quite some time. We know that at least one pair of Goldcrest successfully fledged their brood. Despite some good sightings earlier in the year of Great Spotted Woodpecker, we have had very few records lately and they do not appear to have bred.

## Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

Sound Camp Dawn Chorus took place on the 1st of May this year. We had a good turn out for a fine, sunny dawn that resulted in recording 30 species. This beat our previous record of 27, and a new species was added to the local list when six **Shelduck** flew over. A pair of **Egyptian Geese** were on the Back Pond, and seven **Tufted Duck** arrived and remained throughout the month. On the 12th, a **Red Kite** was seen over The Shed. On the 29th, we were joined by members from the London Bird Club; although the season is getting on and many species are feeding young, we managed to record 26 species, which included three **Swift** and five **House Martin**. There are at least two successful **Great-spotted Woodpecker** broods in Russia Dock Woodland.

# **April 2022**

# **Southwark Park**

A pair of **Shoveler** lingered for another couple of weeks before moving on. The **Tufted Duck** remained throughout the month; perhaps we will get a brood this year. The **Mute Swan** are on eggs, and at least one pair of **Canada Geese** are also sitting on eggs. Several broods of **Mallard** and **Coot** were seen, and they managed to dodge **Gull** and **Heron** predation. The pair of **Little Grebe** were seen and heard several times, but with no evidence of nesting (yet). A

female **Grey Wagtail** was seen on the 14th, but no further sightings have happened since then. A pair of **Stock Dove**, **Goldcrest** and three singing **Blackcap** were seen on the 23rd.

April has been a mostly quiet month; north-east winds held back spring migration for some time, and the hoped-for arrival of interesting migrants did not happen. We only found one **Chiffchaff** on the 18th. Although we found **Willow Warbler** in two other Rotherhithe locations, there were no records in the Park of this scarce species. At least four **Blackcap** were singing around the Park early in the month.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

A **Common Buzzard** that flew over The Shed on the 20th was our first decent raptor for quite a while. Our first true spring migrants arrived this month, with several **House Martin** and six **Swallow** over Stave Hill on the 28th being our highest spring record. A **Willow Warbler** found in the Long Meadow on the 25th seems to be our only record this month. **Blackcap** and **Chiffchaff** numbers also went up with new arrivals. A pair of **Canada Geese** continued to visit Globe Pond, but there was no evidence of breeding yet. A **Sedge Warbler** dropped in at Globe Pond on the 25th and left the following day.

## **March 2022**

## **Southwark Park**

On morning of the 17th, we discovered that Rotherhithe's first **Mandarin Duck** had just returned. We think he arrived with a group of **Tufted Duck** as he did last year and remained for five days. At least two **Shoveler** remained throughout the month. On the 9th, the adult **Common Gull** was again over the Lake. **Black-headed Gull** numbers rose to over 100 at the start of the month, with a dramatic move a few days later when not a single gull remained. Only individuals passing through were seen by the 28th. **Mistle Thrush** were singing near the Lake, and a **Peregrine Falcon** went over on 17th. A **Grey Wagtail** on the 19th was the first for quite some time.

Over 15 **Redwing** were around the bandstand on the 9th. These were no doubt preparing for their move to their breeding grounds. Very few remained in Rotherhithe after the 17th. We had some great views of **Stock Dove** and have seen three individuals together, while a **Collared Dove** was calling near the old café.

## Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The **Kingfisher** remained and was last seen on the 4th. Another highlight was our second record of **Jackdaw** — a single one over Stave Hill on the 28th. Very few **Redwing** overwintered, with only five or so in the area.

# February 2022

## **Southwark Park**

A high count of nine **Shoveler** at the start of the month dropped off to two, whilst a pair of **Tufted Duck** stayed throughout most of the month. **Black-headed Gull** numbers were up and

down over the month, with a high count of around 80 plus. We can expect most, if not all, to be gone in the next few weeks as they return to their breeding colonies. A very nice find on the 8th was a brief visit from an adult **Common Gull**. This is now a scarce species away from the river, although I recall that in my teens I saw them regularly on the playing fields. A single **Mistle Thrush** singing near the Lake was a welcome sound. **Winter Thrushes** have continued to be scarce. A single **Redwing** over the bandstand on the 1st was the only record.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

One **Kingfisher** continued throughout the month, mostly on Downtown Pond. A pair of **Stock Dove** were displaying in Russia Dock Woodland on the 25th. The **Song Thrush** was still singing near the orchard.

# January 2022

## **Southwark Park**

A pair of **Gadwall** remained until mid-January. Another female dropped in briefly. **Shoveler** and **Tufted Duck** numbers rose during the month (mostly males). **Black-headed Gull** numbers remained around 100 plus throughout the month, with a single **Herring Gull** also remaining. **Egyptian Geese** visited most days, and the two **Grey Heron** remained throughout. A single over-wintering **Chiffchaff** was a good find, and we had some good encounters with a **Goldcrest**. On the 24th, a flock of around 20 **Goldfinch** flew over. On the 31st, a **Song Thrush** sang very briefly. This species is very scarce locally and, hopefully, this male will establish a territory. Very few wintering thrushes have stayed in the area, with none in the Park throughout January.

# Stave Hill, Russia Dock Woodland and Globe Pond

The overwintering **Kingfisher** was seen throughout the month, mostly on Downtown Pond with occasional sightings on Globe Pond. Although we only ever saw one bird, we had confirmation that two, a male and a female, were present for several weeks. We recorded one of our few **Mute Swan** flyovers on the 25th, with two flying toward the river. The **Firecrest** was relocated at the turbine, but soon moved. At least three **Coal Tit** were in the Park, along with a **Song Thrush** singing near the orchard. On the 13th, six **Redwing** was our highest number, while five **Greenfinch** at the Long Meadow was a good winter record.
